NOVICE CLASSES (limited to exhibitors who have not won a blue ribbon in a flower show)

- 1. "Come to the Point" — a triangle shape
- 2. "From the Good Earth" — combining any of the following: flowers, fruits, grains, vegetables
- 3. "Diner's Delight" — a table centerpiece to be viewed from all sides

AMATEUR CLASSES

- 4. Wreaths (Artificial accessories may be used.)
 - a. Fresh material
 - b. Dried material
- 5. "Textures" — a collage in low relief. Must contain some plant material. Size of panel not to exceed 28" x 40", depth not to exceed 5". Collage must be prepared for hanging.
- 6. "Hanging Pretty" — design in a container to be hung on a wall
- 7. "Cowboy Courtship" — using a western motif
- 8. "Weathered Beauty" — using wood

- 9. "Holiday Party" — design for a holiday, such as Christmas, Thanksgiving, July 4 or others. Must use plant materials.
- 10. "Friendly Companions" — using two containers unified by plant materials.
- 11. "Little Jewels" — under 6"
- 12. "One Alone" — using one flower
- 13. "Fantasy in Foliages" — using foliage only
- 14. "Still Life" — using dried materials
- 15. "Shades and Tints" — monochromatic (using one color)
- 16. "Field and Garden" — Design using flowers, grains, fruits, vegetables
- 17. "Anything Goes" — Design of any description.
