DIVISION 9 — 4-H SUBJECT MATTER DISPLAY

PREMIUMS

Blue - \$4, Red - \$3, White - \$2

-OPEN TO ALL 4-H MEMBERS

-Eligible for state fair

These classes are open to all 4-H members and are especially appropriate for those projects which have no project exhibits and for locally developed projects. Individual displays are limited in size to 30" in width, 24" deep (front to back), and 30" high. The exhibit may include pictures, models, diagrams, and actual articles. It may be a poster, a three-dimensional display, or a notebook. It should be substantial. Displays must show and explain something the 4-H members have made, done, or learned... such as how and why wool shrinks, why bread rises, safe use of tools, how bees communicate, or how waves are formed. Club displays must have names and addresses of all members and leaders in the club.

DIVISION 10 — 4-H ACTION AREA

Any 4-H member or club may select a time to tell a story, sing a song, show slides, present a demonstration, tell about their club activities, etc.

To participate in action area, member of club should pre-register indicating time and date they wish to present their activity.

These events will not be judged, but will be considered community service activities and will receive recognition certificates.

DIVISION 11 — 4-H LIVESTOCK JUDGING CONTESTS

PREMIUMS

Team: First - \$10, Second - \$7.50, Third - \$5
 Individual: First - \$5, Second - \$4, Third - \$3, Fourth - \$2, Fifth - \$1

RULES:

-Open to all 4-H members. 4-H members must allow their animals to be used in the contest if asked by county extension agent, FFA advisor, or superintendent. Teams to be made up of any 3 members from the same club.

CLASS 1 LARGE ANIMALS

Each contestant shall judge at least two classes each of the following: beef, sheep and swine, and submit written reasons. Reasons class to be designated by the official judge.

CLASS 2 SMALL ANIMALS

Each contestant shall judge at least one fryer class, one part of animal identification, one breed identification, one pelt class, and submit oral and written reasons. Reasons class to be designated by the official judge.

DIVISION 12 — 4-H PIG SCRAMBLE

RULES:

- Special application form required. Extra forms available at Extension Office.

- To be eligible, participants must be currently enrolled in 4-H or agree to enroll in the coming year — those who have completed the third grade may apply — complete the special application form, be willing to abide by the rules of this contest and have not previously caught a pig.

- Successful participants will capture a gilt that they subsequently own. They agree to raise the gilt as a 4-H project and to provide a gilt for the succeeding year's fair that weighs at 60 pounds.

DIVISION 13 — 4-H MARKET LAMB FITTING CONTEST

PREMIUMS

Blue - \$4, Red - \$3, White - \$2

RULES

- This is a team contest open to all enrolled 4-H members.

- Pre-registration is required. All teams must be formed and notify the extension office of their intention to compete by Friday, June 5, 1985.

- Each team will consist of three members. It must include at least one junior and one intermediate 4-H member. There can be no more than one senior per team. This is not a club contest and members are encouraged to form teams that include members from more than one club. It is not restricted to livestock members.

- Participants will be allowed two and one-half hours to wash and fit a market lamb. They will be observed by the judge for the entire time and the judge may ask questions concerning the fitting process at any time. Contestants will also be judged on the finished product.

DIVISION 14 —**MY LAMB'S FAVORITE OUTFIT**

PREMIUMS

Blue - \$4, Red - \$3, White - \$2

RULES:

- Open to all enrolled 4-H members. Design an outfit for your, or a friend's lamb. Lamb must wear the outfit.

- Entries will be judged on originality and attractiveness.

- All entries may participate in the parade which follows the event.

DEPT. II. LIVESTOCK

- Animals must be pre-registered by July 26 at County Extension Office. All livestock must be entered on the fairgrounds by 10 a.m. Wednesday, August 14.

- Market animals must be weighed between 8 and 9 a.m. (See the Market Sale section for shrink rules.)

- Livestock premium checks will not be released until pens are cleaned.

- Animals must appear in the show ring to be judged. Exhibitors must be able to show and handle their own animals.

- Club members with hogs, sheep and steers not making weight (over or under) are eligible to compete in showmanship or feeder classes only.

- The same animal cannot be entered or shown in both breeding and market classes.

- White ribbon market animals are not eligible for the sale.

- Market steers must be polled or dehorned.

- Animals and stalls must be presentable at all times. Manure and waste to be piled as instructed in the general rules in the front of this book by 8 a.m. each morning. Premium money may be withheld if animals are unmanageable, not groomed or if stalls are dirty.

- Beef animals must be double tied: halter and neckrope or chain.

- Animals over maximum weight are not eligible for Grand Champion or Reserve Grand Champion.

- Short scrotum (induced or other cryptorchids) are not eligible to show.

DIVISION 1 — 4-H BREEDING BEEF

PREMIUMS

Blue - \$6, Red - \$5, White - \$4

- Breed champion and reserve champion male and female will be awarded to breeding classes at the discretion of the judge.

- Heifer calves between four and 12 months of age shall be brucellosis vaccinated.

Market Steers will be awarded ribbons as follows: Blue - for steer judged prime or choice; Red - for steer judged good; White - for steer judged standard or below. White ribbon steers will not be eligible to sell.
