

DIVISION 1 — 4-H POULTRY**RULES:**

4-H birds will be disqualified for any of the following defects: crooked feet, leg, spine, blindness, absence of tail feathers, dirty or having any other defects or ailments. This will relate to showmanship as well.

- Entries in single classes cannot compete in pens.
- Recognized breeds will be judged separately (Poultry Breed Classification Guide)
- For small Animal Showmanship, Small Animal Herdsmanship, Small Animal Judging Contest, or Round Robin Showmanship look under Dept III, 4-H Animal Contests.

CLASS E — MARKET CHICKENS (all breeds compete together)**LOT**

2. Roaster, 4 lbs. to 6½ lbs. - no more than 16 weeks
3. Pen of three
 - a. broilers, 7½ lbs. to 12 lbs. total weight — Under 8 weeks
 - b. roasters, 12 lbs. to 19½ lbs. total weight — Under 16 weeks

CLASS F — DUCKS**LOT**

1. Young duck - hatch this year
2. Young drake - hatch this year
3. Old duck - over one year
4. Old drake - over one year
5. Duck with ducklings of same breed
6. Pen - drake with two ducks
7. Single market duck, weight
8. Pen of three market ducks

CLASS G — OTHER DOMESTIC FOWLS (Geese, Guinea, Turkey)**CLASS H — PIGEONS****LOT**

1. Young Hen - hatched this year
2. Young cock - hatched this year

DIVISION 2 — 4-H RABBITS**RULES: (according to A.R.B.A.)**

— 4-H rabbits may be disqualified for any of the following defects or ailments: crooked feet, legs, spine, neck or tail, lop ears, blindness, absence of tail or ears, pot belly, missing or buck teeth, rupture, vent disease, or infected sores. They may be placed down but not disqualified for being over or under weight for their age class or having other defects or ailments.

— A doe which will kindle within one week of the Fair or a doe with young litter under two weeks old cannot be exhibited.

— For small Animal showmanship, Small Animal Herdsmanship, Small Animal judging contest, or Round Robin showmanship, look under Department III, 4-H Animal contests.

CLASS A — HEAVY WEIGHT

(California, French Lop, New Zealand Giants, etc.)

LOT

1. Senior buck - over 8 months
2. Senior doe - over 8 months
3. Intermediate buck - 6-8 months
4. Intermediate doe - 6-8 months
5. Junior buck - under 6 months
6. Junior doe - under 6 months
7. Pre-junior buck or doe - under 3 months
8. Doe with litter of same breed - over two weeks

CLASS B — LIGHT WEIGHT (Dutch, Polish, Mini Lop, Netherland Dwarf, etc.)**LOT**

1. Senior buck - over 6 months

3. Junior buck - under 6 months
4. Junior doe - under 6 months
5. Doe with litter of same breed — over two weeks

CLASS C — FUR ANIMALS (Satin, Rex, Angora, Champagne, Chinchilla, etc.)**LOT**

1. Senior buck - over 6 months
2. Senior doe - over 6 months
3. Junior buck - under 6 months
4. Junior doe - under 6 months
5. Doe and litter of same breed - over 2 weeks

CLASS D — MARKET ANIMALS (All breeds judged together)**LOT**

1. Fryer - 3½ lb. to 5 lb. - under 69 days
2. Roaster - 4½ to 7½ lb. - under 90 days
3. Pen of three
 - a. fryers - 10½ to 15 lb. - under 69 days
 - b. roasters - 13½ lb. to 22½ lb. - under 90 days

DIVISION 3 — OTHER 4-H SMALL ANIMALS**RULES:**

— 4-H small animals may be disqualified for any of the following defects or ailments: crooked feet, legs, spine, neck or tail, blindness, rupture, vent disease, or infected sores.

— Small animals will be against other animals in that species: i.e. guinea pigs will show against other guinea pigs.

— For small animal showmanship, small animal herdsmanhip, small animal judging contest, or round robin showmanship, look under Department III, 4-H animal contest.

DEPT. V. HORSES**Horse Judging Contest To Be Held July 7, Tatone's Arena, Boardman**

Open to all 4-H members. Each contestant will judge halter classes, riding classes, and tack-feed identification. Each contestant will submit oral and written reasons on class as specified by judge.

4-H Horse Show, August 10, 9 a.m.

Entrants must be preregistered by July 29, at County Extension Office. Entrants requesting stalling will be assigned stalls prior to the show.

— Open to 4-H members enrolled in a 4-H project in Morrow County.

— Contestants must ride horses they have owned or leased and have trained since June 1, 1985, and must do all work possible in preparation for showing the horses.

— The horse contests will be conducted according to rules and recommendations of the "4-H Horse Contest Outline, 4-H 1301" and "Oregon 4-H Horse Project, 4-H 130" and rules established and set down by the Morrow County 4-H Advisory Committee.

— Equipment: Western - stock saddles, bits and reins optional, hackamore bosals, snaffles acceptable. Hackamore bits, tie downs, running martingales and draw reins are not allowed. Plain leather or flat curb chains must be one-half inch in width.

— Dress: Should conform to class. Boots are required, hats and spurs are optional. No chaps allowed except in trail horse class.

— There will be no horses on trail or jumping course after course set-up. There will be no horses except in trailer area, arena and far east part of grounds.

— Age classifications: Beginner - first year members in the 4th or 5th grade; Junior - second or third year members in the 5th or 6th grade; Intermediate - 7th, 8th, 9th grades; Senior - 10th, 11th, and 12th grades.

— Each member must use same horse for showmanship, equitation, and trail but are not required to use same for both Western and English classes.

— Exception: Member exhibiting in colt training, colt showmanship and first year under saddle may exhibit more than one horse at fair. A member cannot cross-enter horse shown in the colt showmanship and-or colt training class. However, if member has no other equitation horse, first year under saddle animal may be used in regular classes, but may not enter other equitation classes.

— The All-Around Award is based upon: One-third from showmanship, one-third from Western or English equitation, and one-third from trail horse class. For All-Around Award in each age group, only one horse's point will count. Entrant will specify on entry from which horse to count points on. Entrant will also specify whether to count Western or English equitation on entry blank. Entrants not specifying will receive lowering of points.
