

## DIVISION 2 — 4-H HORSE SHOWMANSHIP

### PREMIUMS

Blue - \$6, Red - \$5, White - \$4

Basis for scoring: Member's appearance - 25 percent; animal's appearance - 25 percent; showing - 50 percent. Showmanship is the exhibitor's demonstration of courtesy, grooming, poise, confidence, and knowledge of how to fit, train, and show horse to best advantage. Exhibitors may show in English or Western attire.

## DIVISION 3 — 4-H TRAIL HORSE CLASS

### PREMIUMS

Blue - \$6, Red - \$5, White - \$4

Judged on performance and manners with emphasis on smoothness with which rider controls horse and negotiates obstacles in prescribed course. **Not to be judged on speed.** There will be a time limit on each individual. After two refusals or unnecessary delays, the participant must pass and go on to the next obstacle. There will be a minimum of five obstacles used from the following: Walk through cavalletti, open and close gate, simulated water obstacle, walk over bridge, drag rope, back through marked course, dismount and mount on offside, mailbox, carry object to specified point, lead horse over jump or obstacle, sidepass. Contestant will be scored on each obstacle and given a total score for performance based on poise, manners, use of aids, and smoothness of performance. Exhibitors may show English or Western. Class will be judged by volunteers starting after Showmanship Class and running until lunch.

## DIVISION 4 — 4-H BAREBACK EQUITATION

### PREMIUMS

Blue - \$6, Red - \$5, White - \$4

Basis for scoring:

Clothing and equipment	15 percent
Seat and Hands	35 percent
Performance	50 percent

In all divisions, horses will be worked as a group at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. The judge will then ask each individual for any or all of the movements listed in the 4-H Contest Outline. Contestants will not be asked to mount or dismount. Exhibitors may show English or Western.

## DIVISION 5 — 4-H WESTERN EQUITATION

### PREMIUMS

Blue - \$6, Red - \$5, White - \$4

Basis for scoring:

Clothing and Equipment	15 percent
Seat and Hands	35 percent
Performance	50 percent

In all divisions, horses will be worked as a group at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. The judge will then ask each individual for any or all of the movements listed in the 4-H Contest Outline.

## DIVISION 6 — 4-H COLT GROUND TRAINING

### PREMIUMS

Blue - \$6, Red - \$5, White - \$4

All age contestants compete together. Entrants will do as many of the 14 items listed in step 4B of the Oregon 4-H Horse Advancement Program as they can in the 15 minute time limit. Contestant must give judge a list of exercises to be attempted. Judging will be based on how all items attempted are accomplished. Colts must be born in 1983, 1984, or 1985.

## DIVISION 7 — 4-H ENGLISH EQUITATION

### PREMIUMS

Blue - \$6, Red - \$5, White - \$4

Horses to be shown at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. To be judged 50 percent on performance and 50 percent on hands and seat. Required movements in the 4-H Horse contest outline. Either hunt seat or saddle seat tack and attire are acceptable. Riders will be judged on effective use of aids and horse control. Emphasis on posture and balance.

## DIVISION 8 — 4-H HUNT SEAT EQUITATION OVER FENCES

### PREMIUMS

Blue - \$6, Red - \$5, White - \$4

### LOT

#### 1. Intermediates and Seniors

Riders to be judged over a course of nine fences, maximum, not to exceed three feet in height. Jumps may include post and rail, brush, coop, wall, oxer, crossed poles, gate, and/or picket fence. Course will be posted. Any or all contestants may be called back to perform at three gaits, or any task asked by the judge. To be judged on performance and hands and seat. Except for refusals, jumping faults of the horse are not to be considered unless it is the result of the rider's ability. Three cumulative refusals will eliminate. If a refusal occurs in a double or triple, riders shall rejump all elements of the combination. Hard hats with chin straps and boots required. Hunt seat tack and attire or modifications of same accepted. Spurs and crops are optional.

#### 2. Beginners and Juniors

Riders to be judged over a course of six fences, maximum, not to exceed two feet six inches in height; crossed poles. Judging and performance other than jumping to be the same as in the above class. Course to be posted.

## DIVISION 9 — ADVANCED EQUITATION

### PREMIUMS

Blue - \$6, Red - \$5, White - \$4

This class may be ridden either Western or English. This is an individual workout class. It will be judged on hands, seat, and legs while performing the specified maneuvers and a two-minute free-style ride. **Before performing, the rider must provide the judge with a typewritten program of his/her freestyle ride.**

#### Mandatory Test — 50 points (See accompanying diagrams)

1. A Enter ordinary trot sitting.  
X Halt. Salute. Proceed ordinary trot sitting.  
C Track right.
2. F Half circle right, 33' diameter, returning to track at B
3. C Halt 5 seconds. Proceed ordinary trot sitting.
4. HXF Change of rein, strong trot sitting. Pick up canter, right lead between F and A
5. A Circle right, width of arena.
6. E Halt, back six steps. Proceed ordinary trot sitting.
7. MXK Change of rein, strong trot sitting. Pick up canter, left lead, between K and A.
8. A Canter circle, left lead, width of arena.
9. FXH Change of rein.  
H Ordinary trot sitting  
C Walk  
B Ordinary trot sitting
10. A Down center  
X Halt. Salute. Leave arena free walk. Proceed to C, right or left around perimeter of ring to A, then out of ring.

#### EQUITATION OF MANDATORY TEST — 50 POINTS

General impressions, seat, hands, willingness of horse, regularity and freedom of paces correct use of aids. Contestants may show Stock Seat, Hunt Seat, Dressage Seat or Saddle Seat. No whips are allowed unless contestant rides sidesaddle.

At the initial halt and salute, the girl nods head; the boy removes hat, puts hat down to his leg, nods, and puts hat back on. "Track Right at C" means to go into the corner making obtuse corners. Make all changes in direction or gait as rider's shoulder passes marker.

Each contestant may have caller or reader who will stand at letter E or B. If reader gives wrong direction, rider must do the test correctly or be penalized.

Any horse leaving arena not under control will be eliminated. Test starts and ends at A.
