DEPT. VII. HOME ECONOMICS

DIVISION 1 — 4-H CLOTHING

— Members must currently be enrolled in the skill level in which they are exhibiting.

— In Skill Level 1-3, each member may enter one or more classes for the skill level in which they are enrolled. In Skill Level 4-9, members should enter the one class listed for their skill level.

— In addition to the regular 4-H exhibit tag, which should be pinned securely to the upper left shoulder of the garment, each clothing, knitting and crocheting article must be labeled as follows:

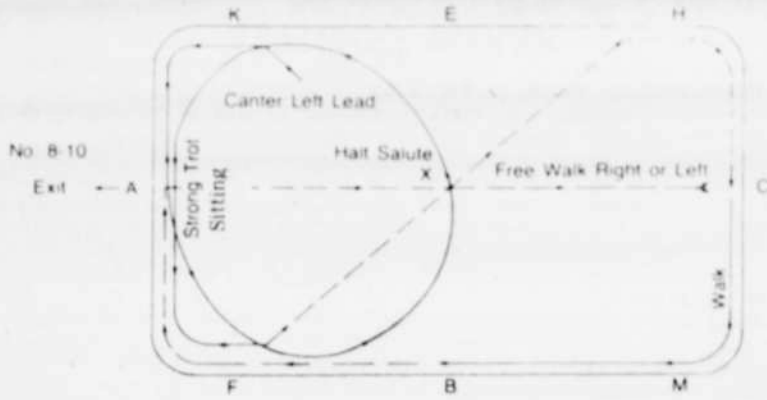
— This should be typed or printed in indelible pencil or ink on a piece of white cotton fabric and sewed on each garment or article. Dresses or skirts should have the sewed on the inside of the back hem.

—NEW RULE: A member may exhibit a different garment(s) for construction and style revue.

— Wool garments to be considered for wool award must be labeled as 100 percent wool and include tag on sales slip from purchase.

— Fabric choice in skill levels 4-9 may be anything suitable for the article or garment. Garment may mean a single piece or a two or three piece ensemble. See the "Construction" section of the 4-H Clothing Guidelines for Leaders:" (4-H 9210L) for construction skills suggested for skill levels 4-9.

Skill Level 1 - Use a medium weight, firmly woven fabric such as cotton, cotton blend or stable, non-bulky knit fabrics. Also use simple pattern with matching shapes and few details. Garments or articles with facings, gathers, zippers, and-or set-in sleeves are not acceptable. Seam finishes should be used if appropriate.



FREE STYLE RIDE — 100 Points

Free style ride to follow mandatory performance. Rider must provide judge with a typewritten program of his-her free-style ride before performing this section of the class. Riders will be scored on their performance, during their two minutes, similarly to the mandatory test.

DIVISION 10 — INDIVIDUAL BARREL RACE

PREMIUMS

Blue - \$6, Red - \$5, White - \$4

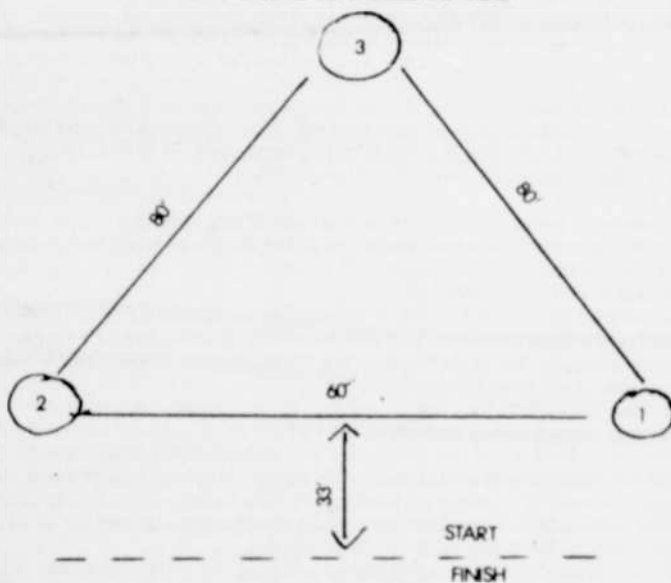
Three barrels shall be placed in a triangular formation. Number 1 and 2 barrels are set 33 feet from the start-finish line 60 feet apart. Number 3 is 80 feet from No. 1 and No. 2 barrels.

Rider crosses starting line, circles No. 1 barrel to the right, crosses No. 2 barrel, circles it left, No. 3 barrel, circles it left and races across the finish line. OR crosses starting line to No. 2 barrel circles it left, crosses to No. 1 barrel, circles it right, runs to No. 3 circles right and races across the finish line.

DIVISION 11 — POLE BENDING

PREMIUMS

Blue - \$6, Red - \$5, White - \$4

Six poles shall be set in a straight line, spaced 20 feet apart with the start-finish line 20 feet in front of the first pole.

The rider crosses starting line, races to the No. 6 pole, pivots and bends back through poles pivoting No. 1 pole, bends back through poles, turns and races across finish line.
