

7. Shrinkage: All sale animals will be weighed off the truck, Wednesday, August 14, 1985. A two (2) percent shrink will be given to animals hauled ten (10) miles or more. A three (3) percent shrink will be given to animals hauled less than ten (10) miles. A four (4) percent shrink will be applied to all animals brought onto the fairgrounds the night before weighing, this will be done regardless of whether the animals are unloaded or remain in the truck overnight.

8. All animal weight limitations will be evaluated by the respective barn superintendents at the scales. Qualified judges will evaluate the animals and estimate if beef and lambs will grade good, choice or better and if swine will grade U.S. No. 1, No. 2, or No. 3. The judges' estimates will be based on exterior finish and conformation. The judges' determination will be final. Actual grade of beef and swine will be determined on the rail at Hill Meat Co.

9. All market animals are consigned to the sale unless excused by the sale committee.

10. There is unlimited bidding on 4-H and FFA grand champion animals. The reserve grand champion can sell for the same as the lowest priced grand champion animal, but no more. Other animals cannot sell for more than the lowest priced reserve grand champion of the same species.

11. All sale animals will be returned to exhibitors stalls following the sale. Individual exhibitors will remain responsible for feeding their animals and for the cleanliness of their stalls until exhibits are released. Failure to care for your project after the sale will result in forfeiture of any premium money for that project. Sale checks will be mailed to exhibitors on Monday.

... to qualify, an exhibitor must show one or more (horned) Hereford as follows: 1. Hereford steer; 2. Breeding female registered with the American Hereford Association (horned); 3. Be currently enrolled in 4-H of FFA; 4. Show evidence that market animals were sired by a horned Hereford bull. This award is to be given only if there are five or more exhibitors in any combination of market and breeding classes. Judge of beef classes will determine the Outstanding Hereford Exhibitor. When possible, an OWNIHA member will present the award.

3. OUTSTANDING 4-H and/or OUTSTANDING FFA ANGUS EXHIBITOR - silver trophy by Western States Angus Auxiliary; 1872 Cook Rd., Burlinghton, Washington

... selection of the winner is to be based on showing placing of individual animals, placings in showmanship. This is open to exhibitors with one or more breeding and/or market animals. It must be kept in mind that the purpose of this award is the promotion of the Angus breed. The winning of the auxiliary trophy in previous years shall not exclude an exhibitor from winning it again. The judge of the Junior Beef Show will be asked to make the selection of the winner based on showing placing of individual animals and placings in showmanship. The following system must be followed: conformation placint 50 points Grands Champion, 30 points - Reserve Champion. Showmanship placing 25 points - first, 15 points - second, 10 points - third, 5 points if participated in showmanship. (American system 1-2-3; Danish system 1st blue - 2nd blue - 3rd blue.) If steers and breeding animals are both exhibited points may be combined to select a winner.
