LCDR Cole is completing requirements for his Masters Degree in Physic (Underwater Acoustics) and expects to graduate in December, 1986, prior to assignment to SSPO Washington, D.C.

LCDR Cole graduated from Heppner High School in 1964, enlisted in the U.S. Navy and reported for Recruit Training June 15, 1964. He advanced to Senior Chief Machinist Mate prior to being commissioned as an ENSIGN USN following graduation from Purdue University's Navak Enlisted Scientific Education Program May 15, 1977 with a BSE degree in Nuclear Engineering. His promotion to Lt. Commander became effective May 31, 1985.

LCDR Cole has been stationed at or assigned to 16 basis, training facilities or ships including MAG Viet Nam, USS Rockbridge APA 225, USS Enterprise Cvan-65, USS

Hepray L. Stimson SSBN 655 (blue), and USS Michigan SSBN 727 (gold) in his 21 years of naval services.

LCDR Cole was married to the former Susan Marie Hammond, August 22, 1970, in Pennsylvania. She is a 1969 graduate of York Academy in West Point, Virginia. ## County not influenced by DTP vaccine shortage

Adequate supplies of DTP (diphtheria, tetanus, and pertussis) vaccine are now available for Oregon public clinics. Dr. Lester Wright, Oregon State Health Officer, recently announced that Oregon's public health departments are resuming the administration of the temporarily postponed fourth and fifth doses of DTP vaccine. This announcement is in concurrence with the national recommendations from the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices and the Committee on Infectious Diseases of the American Academy of Pediatrics.

Dr. Wright urges all parents of children (under 7 years of age) who had their fourth or fifth dose of DTP postponed to call their physician or county health department for an appointment. It is especially important to make every effort to give DTP vaccine to children attending day care centers and those scheduled to enter kindergarten or first grade this fall.

Morrow County Health Nurse Pat Wright reports that the shortage did not effect Morrow County. Because two cases of whopping cough were reported here last winter, the county's supply of the vaccine was never cut off.
