## Sheriff Drago warns of increased credit card crimes

Sheriff Roy Drago of Morrow County warns, "Credit card crimes are on the increase and a rising number of card holders will find their cards lost or stolen this year."

Last year, Americans lost over \$150 million to credit card fraud through VISA and MasterCard alone.

While the statistics are alarming, there are precautions you can take to prevent unauthorized use of your credit cards.

In order to protect yourself against any credit card theft, the sheriff offers these tips to establish proper card security and reduce your potential losses:

- When driving around town or on a trip, never keep credit cards or receipts in your glove compartment.

Someone could easily help themselves to your card or account number.

- Never leave your credit cards in your briefcase, even if it is at your side or in your car.

- Always check your card when an attendant returns it to you. It's easy for them to grab the wrong card when repairs are completed.

- Keep your cards secure by always keeping them in your wallet and never loose in a pocket or purse.

- Always keep your card in sight when making a purchase.

- If possible, take the carbon receipts with you to protect your account number and expiration date.

- Don't give your card number over the phone to solicitors or callers claiming to be taking surveys or needing your card number to verify your identity as a prize winner.

- If your card is missing, report the loss to your local law enforcement

- Appointment of budget committee members, newspaper of record, supervisory and confidential employees, budget officer, depositories of funds, representatives to apply for federal funds, school attorney, auditor;

- Authorization to borrow funds, if needed.

agency. Immediately call the issuing company or bank and give the following information: your name, address with zip code, credit card number, and phone number.

Tell them how you discovered the cards missing, when and where.

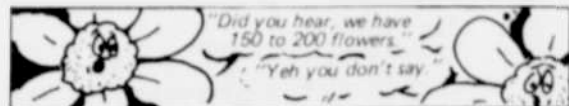
You may wish to keep a record of your own credit cards and bank cards for your files in case your cards are ever lost or stolen. You can easily do this by writing the following information on an index card and keeping it in your personal files in a safe place: Name of card, account number, expiration date, issuing company or bank and their toll-free telephone number. This information filed in a safe place provides a ready reference for you to notify each credit card company of your loss.

"Following these easy tips can help to discourage credit card theft," Sheriff Drago concluded. "Protect yourself against credit card theft with these tips on credit card safety."

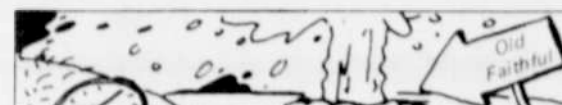

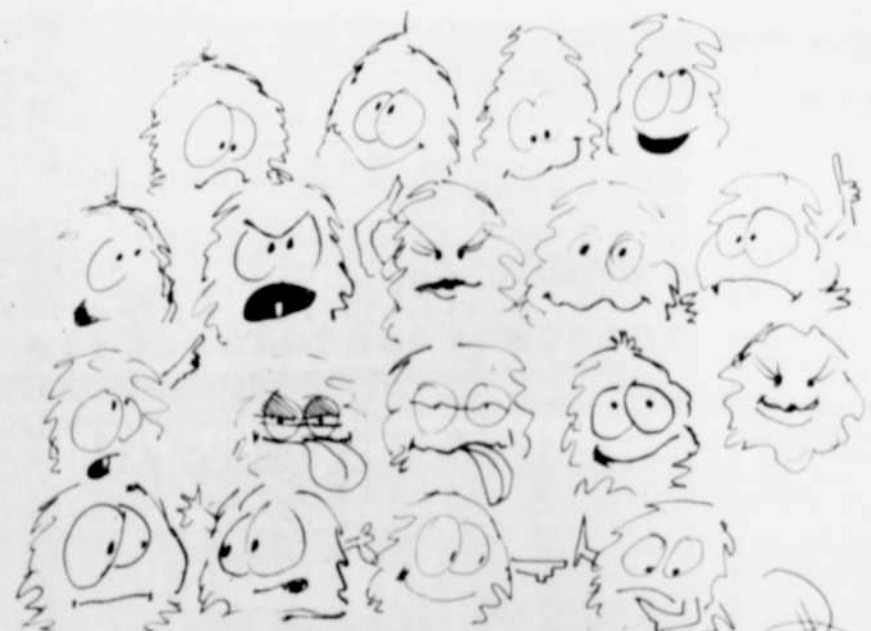
