D.A.'s Report

The Morrow County District Attorney's Office at the Morrow County Courthouse in Heppner reports handling the following business during the past week:

Dean E. Kennedy, 21, Boardman, was found guilty of Resisting Arrest and Not Guilty of Criminal Trespass by jury trial. He was sentenced July 9 to 30 days in jail and a fine of \$350 which was suspended to \$150 fine and one Bench Probation.

Rudy O. Gonzales, 49, Seattle, Washington, charged with Assault IV, was sentenced July 11 to 100 days in jail and a \$200 fine which was suspended to a \$135 fine on the condition that there be no contact with the victim and daughter of the victim.

Robert Lerner Manning, 22, Boardman, charged with Sodomy I entered a plea of not guilty on July 11.
