to show their skills. A number will also be exhibiting their sewing projects.

Last year, Swayne Evans of Irrigon carried home the champion honors in foods from state fair. This year, he'll have more male companionship in the 4-H kitchen and fashion revue at fair. They'll be a group worth watching.

### Set your sights on Hazelnut Prune Cake

Two Oregon favorites - hazelnuts and prunes - are thick in a spicy cake at the center of this year's Oregon Wheat Growers League cake baking contest.

A rich chocolate frosting tops the Oregon Hazelnut Prune Cake, which is excellent unfrosted, too.

The contest, sponsored annually by the OWGL to promote public awareness of the wheat industry, is conducted through local county fairs throughout Oregon.

In addition, bakers can enter the contest at the Oregon State Fair, whether or not they've entered a local county fair. State Fair contest time is 2 p.m. August 27. The procedure is to bake the official 1985 Oregon Hazelnut Prune cake with Easy Chocolate Frosting, (recipe follows); take it on a covered board or cardboard to the Jackman Long Building at the State fair grounds on Tuesday, August 27. Those entering the contest will be admitted to the State Fair free. Judging starts at 2 p.m. After the cakes are judged, contestants may take at least three-quarters of their cake home, leaving one-quarter on display for the remainder of the fair.

Outstanding 4-H'er Jodie Fitzwater of Lebanon, will demonstrate making the cake during the judging at State Fair. Fitzwater, a nine year 4-H foods member was selected to receive the 1985 Oregon Wheat Commission Scholarship through the 4-H program.

This year's contest recipe came from OWGL member Alda Scharf of Amity. "A friend gave it to me, and a friend gave it to her," she says.

The recipe was ideal for the contest because "for the last few years we've been trying to feature Oregon products in our cakes," Scharf explains. "This one has the prunes and filberts (hazelnuts) - and it's a little bit different."

It never lasts very long around here," Scharf adds with a laugh. "We like it real well unfrosted."

Because of the raw egg in the frosting, refrigeration is recommended if the cake would otherwise sit out at room temperature, or in the warm sun at a picnic. As an alternative, the egg may be replaced by 1/4 cup milk.

#### Oregon Hazelnut Prune Cake

- 1 cup dried prunes
- 2 cups sugar
- 1 cup cooking oil
- 3 eggs
- 1 cup buttermilk
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 cup chopped hazelnuts, divided
- 2 cups all purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon cloves
- 1 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1 teaspoon allspice
- 1 teaspoon salt

Plump up the dried prunes by simmering briefly with a small amount of water. Beat together sugar and oil. Add eggs one at a time. Add buttermilk and soda, and beat well. Chop cooled prunes; gradually add to batter along with 1/4 cup of chopped hazelnuts. Sift together flour, cinnamon, cloves, nutmeg, allspice and salt and stir in.

Cut waxed paper to fit the bottom of an angel food tube pan, and place in the pan. Grease and flour the pan. Sprinkle the bottom with the remaining 1/4 cup chopped hazelnuts, and pour batter on top. Bake at 325 degrees for 1 hour and 15 minutes. Serves 20.

#### Easy Chocolate Frosting

- 1/2 cup margarine
- 2 1/2 cups powdered sugar, sifted
- 1 egg
- 3 squares unsweetened chocolate
- 1 teaspoon vanilla

Cream margarine, gradually add powdered sugar, creaming well. Add egg and mix thoroughly. Melt and cool chocolate, and blend into butter-sugar mixture. Add vanilla; beat until spreading consistency. If necessary, thin with milk. (Because of the raw egg, refrigeration of the frosted cake is recommended. Or, substitute 1/4 cup milk for the egg.
