

## Lexington woman takes 2 sweepstakes ribbons



Some people tell me it's not worth the time and expense to raise a garden, says Jean Brazzell, "but I enjoy an attractive yard. Weeding and taking care of it is my recreation and enjoyment."

Brazzell's "recreation" just won her two sweepstakes ribbons at last week's Morrow County Fair. In addition to the "recreation" time spent out and away from people, Brazzell does the bookkeeping for the Lexington Machine Shop which she and her husband own. Also during the school year, she teaches piano students and year round is active in the Methodist Church and on the 4-H leaders council.

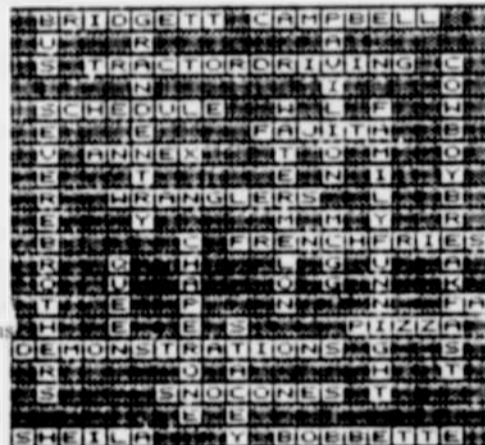

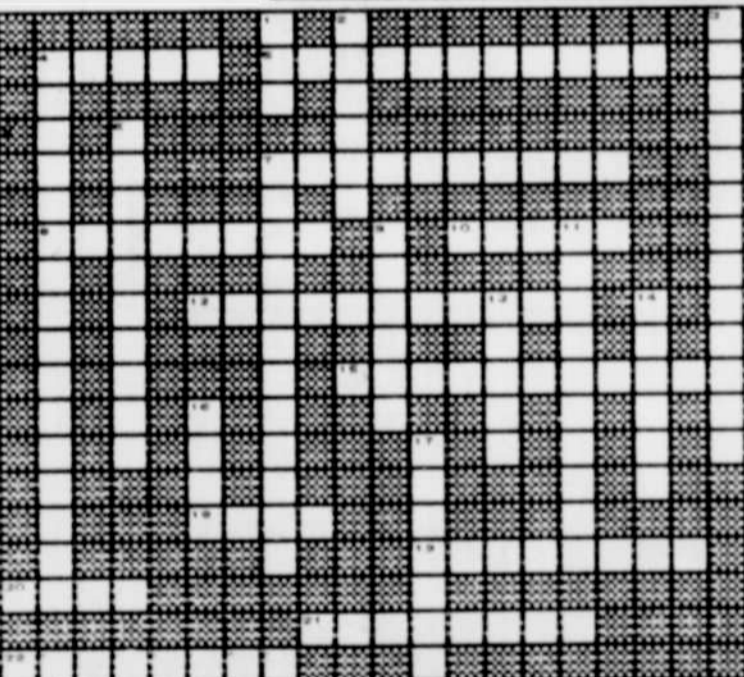
