Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office at the Morrow County Courthouse in Heppner reports handling or dispatching the following business during the past week:

On August 12, a Boardman ambulance transported a female from a Boardman residence to Good Shepherd Hospital in Hermiston.

Also on August 12, the Boardman Fire Dept. responded to a grass fire at U & I which turned out to be a controlled burned; and to a grass fire which turned out to be a garbage dump at EO Farms. The latter was extinguished.

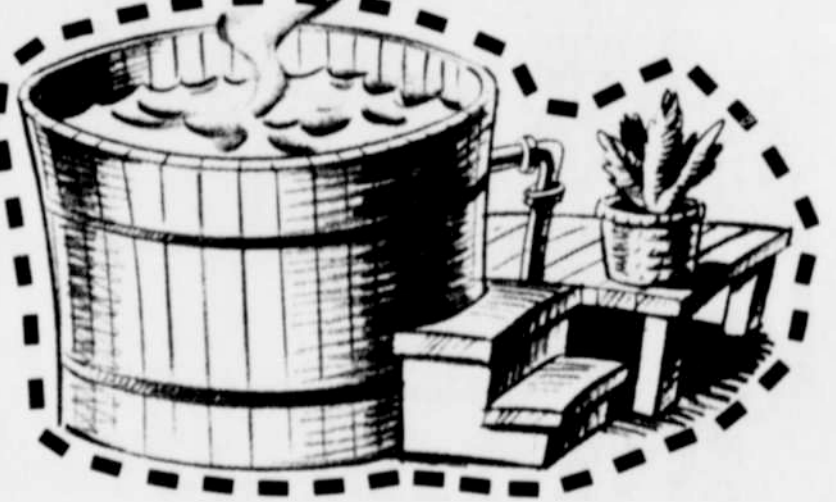
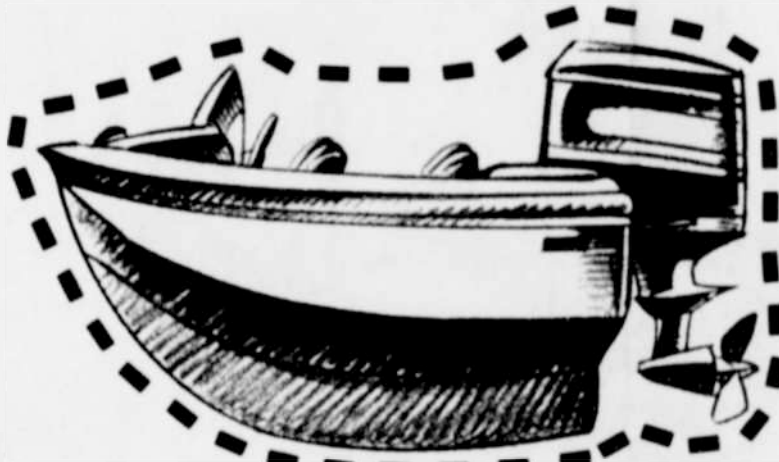
