Obituaries

Ella V. Taylor

The funeral for Ella Viola Taylor was held at 2 p.m. Friday, August 23 in the chapel of Munselle-Rhodes Funeral Home, with concluding service and interment at the Milton-Freewater Cemetery.

Mrs. Taylor, 69, died in La Grande Wednesday, Aug. 21, 1985, at the Valley View Manor Nursing Home.

She was born Nov. 5, 1915, in Milton-Freewater, the youngest of William Henry and Nancy (Moore) Kelly's 11 children. She attended the Forks School on the Walla Walla River.

On Oct. 13, 1933, she married Bernard Taylor in Walla Walla. They lived in Walla Walla nine years, returning to Milton-Freewater in 1944. Since then they lived at their home on the Walla Walla River. Her husband died Oct. 24, 1984.

Mrs. Taylor enjoyed gardening, handwork and homemaking. She was a past member of the Forks Friendship Club.

Surviving are three daughters: Glenna (Mrs. Leland) Sams of La Grande, Gayle (Mrs. Paul) Arbogast of Heppner, and Ginger (Mrs. Cecil) Thorne of Bend; brother John Kelly of Milton-Freewater; sisters Bertha Carlson of Walla Walla, and Vivian (Mrs. Marvin) Gilmore of Milton-Freewater; and nine grandchildren.

John W. Rasmussen

A graveside funeral for John W. Rasmussen began at 11 a.m. Friday, August 23 at Olney Cemetery. Friends were requested to meet there for the service.

Rasmussen, 82, died Tuesday, Aug. 20, 1985, at Amber Valley Care Center.

He was born in Copenhagen, Denmark, Nov. 14, 1902.

On Dec. 1, 1925, he married Nielsine Kristiansen in Portland, Maine.

Rasmussen lived in Milton-Freewater 16 years before moving to Pendleton 32 years ago. He operated a Mobil gas station in Pendleton, and also worked at the Eastern Oregon Hospital and Training Center seven years before retiring in 1967.

He was a member of the Peace Lutheran Church, and Eureka Lodge 32, IOOF.

Survivors include his wife, Nielsine Rasmussen of Pendleton; daughters Bettie Doherty of Heppner, and Helen Gillette of Pendleton; three sons: John Jr. of Pebble Beach, Calif., Henry of Portage, Wis., and Paul of Boise, Idaho; eight grandchildren and two great grandchildren.

Sheriff's Report

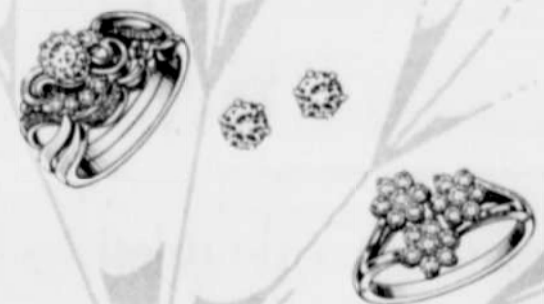
