Students from Heppner High School will go to Pendleton High School for a meeting with representatives of Oregon's state colleges and universities at 1 p.m., September 23. Students from Ione High School will meet with representatives at Riverside High School, 1 p.m., September 25.

This program supplements the counseling program of area high schools by giving students first-hand information about program of study offerings, admission requirements, housing, costs to attend, financial aid, scholarships, and other information important to post-high school planning.

Parents are also encouraged to attend the program which will fea-

ture information sessions with representatives from Eastern Oregon State College, Western Oregon State College, Oregon Institute of Technology, Oregon State University, Portland State University, Southern Oregon State College, and the University of Oregon.

The Oregon State System of Higher Education high school visitation program reaches almost all public and private high schools in Oregon. The program's goal is to stimulate and guide post-high school planning by students and provide them with an introduction to the programs and services of the state colleges and universities.

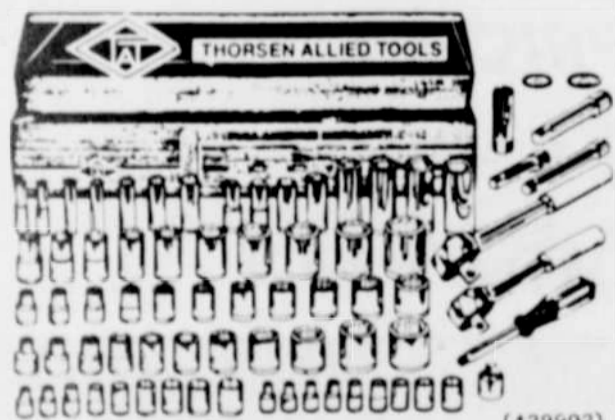

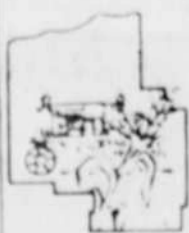
