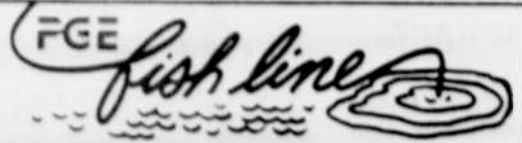

Workshop series to discuss going into business

"Going Into Business" is the topic of a workshop by that name to be presented by Blue Mountain Community College's Small Business Development Center beginning Oct. 2 in Hermiston.

The workshop series will feature six sessions to be held on successive Wednesday evenings from 7 to 10 through November 13. The class will meet at the college's Hermiston Center, Radelco Building, 405 North First Street.

The first session is titled "The Basic Steps and Paperwork." Other topics will cover steps to a successful business venture including: legal structures and accounting systems; keeping records and making decisions; marketing, advertising, promotion; financing your business; and the business plan.

"This is a practical how-to series featuring lots of information, presentation by business professionals and plenty of discussion," according to Tom Hampson, director of the business assistance center.

The sessions can be taken as a series or individually. Information presented, when taken as a package, will provide participants with the basics of a total business plan.

New business owners are especially encouraged to take the entire series, Hampson noted. Persons wishing more information should contact the Business Center at 276-6233.
