Cecilia A. Healy died Thursday, Sept. 26, 1985, at Pioneer Memorial Hospital. She was 63.

Born in Heppner Feb. 24, 1922, she was the daughter of John and Annie (Kenny) Healy.

She was graduated from Heppner High School in 1940, and then worked as a bookkeeper for a lumber brokerage in Portland. She returned to Heppner in 1980.
