 The Condon Blue Devils used an impressive ground attack and an opportunistic defense to defeat the lone Cardinals 60-6 on Friday, Oct. 10. Condon outgained lone 521 total yards to 245 total yards and the Blue Devils use four interceptions, two of which were returned for touchdowns, to wallop the Cardinals for the second year in a row.
 The Cardinals kicked off to begin the game and less than 30 seconds later found themselves trailing 8-0. This quick score was typical as in each game, lone has similarly given up a quick score. The good luck continued for the Blue Devils as moments later Harry Bean intercepted a Kevin Ball pass and ran the ball in from 15 yards out to increase Condon's lead, and with the extra point conversion, the score stood at 16-0 at the end of one period.
 It was here that lone suprised Condon with a flea flicker play that produced the Cardinals only score of the game. Ken Snider passed three yards downfield to Eric Pointer, who then pitched the ball back to Chris Rea who found open field for 60 yards. The conversion attempt failed and the Cardinals trailed only 16-6 after the first play of the second

quarter.
 Condon scored twice in the second quarter on runs of 2 and 3 yards while holding the Cardinals in check the rest of the quarter.
 Condon again scored 30 points in the second half, but lone failed to score at all. Condon had touchdown runs by Steve and Scott Miller and a third by Bean. The Blue Devils also got six points on another interception run back by Chad Smith.
 Offensively, the Cardinals were led by Rea's 48 yards rushing and the pass combination of Snider to Pointer that netted 60 yards. Snider led the Cards defensively with 20 tackles and Kevin Ball added nine more.
 In a reaction to the game, assistant coach for the Cardinals, Del LaRu, said, "I think it was one of our better games. The interceptions definitely hurt us, especially since two were returned for touchdowns. I was pleased with the fact that we didn't get down after Condon scored and we had a better attitude about the game than we have had for a few weeks. Basically, neglecting the mistakes, we played well but we were simply outmanned."
 lone's next game is on Friday, Oct. 18 at home. The Cardinals

will lock helmets with the Echo Cougars at 7:30 p.m.
