- Promote No-Till annual cropping, including interest in No-Till drills.

- Work to secure adequate funding for SWCD programs. Investigate interest in developing special taxing district.
- Keep informed of current legislative affairs.
- Investigate interest in developing small reservoirs in upper watersheds.

- Continue efforts in weed control. Secure adequate funding for program.
- Continue field trials and persist in quest for grant funds for research.

During Fiscal Year 1985 (October 1, 1984 to September 30, 1985), the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service paid out \$234,925 to Morrow County producers through the Agricultural Conservation Program (ACP). ACP is a cost-share program to solve conservation problems.
