the business meeting and vote for a proposed change in the Association by-laws, and elect a new president, vice-president and five directors to the American Angus Association board.

The Annual Meeting is held in conjunction with the annual Convention and Banquet, and the 1986 National Angus Show during the North American International Livestock Exposition.
