

# Mustangs shut out Rockets 28-0 in season finale

Heppner's football team concluded their season with a 28-0 victory over the Pilot Rock Rockets on Friday, Nov. 1. The Mustangs finished 3-5 in Columbia Basin Conference and overall, their best record since 1982 when they were 5-4.

The Mustangs jumped out to a quick 7-0 lead when Alex Lindsay raced 33 yards down the right sideline and then added the extra point.

In the second period, Heppner increased their advantage to 15-0. Lindsay scooted in from three yards out and Loran Hayes ran in the extra points. The touchdown was set up on a 35-yard run by Lindsay.

After a Heppner fumble, the Rockets threatened to score. However, David Pedro blocked Rick Rasmussen's 47-yard field goal.

The Mustangs added two fourth quarter touchdowns to win 28-0. Lindsay intercepted a Rasmussen pass and raced 72 yards for the touchdown. His extra point kick was blocked.

The final Heppner score came when Dick Devin sneaked in from five yards out and Todd Lindsay added the extra point. Devin's touchdown was set up on a 32-yard run by Scott Buschke.

The Mustangs produced 305 yards of total offense, with all but one yard on the ground, their highest output of the year.

Defensively the Mustangs were led by Bob Riehl who had another fine game with 15 tackles and 26 defensive points. Pedro added ten

tackles.  
"I was really pleased with our effort," stated head coach Tim Birkby. "It was a good way for our five seniors to go out." The five seniors are Hayes, Alex and Todd Lindsay, Chris McLaughlin, and Jack Estberg.

"We achieved the two goals we set at the beginning of the season. We won three games which was one of our goals. Our other goal was to give up more than three touchdowns a game and only one team (Wahtonka) scored more than three against us. We are very much looking forward to next year when we should be a playoff contender," the coach concluded.
