## Boardman needs more teachers

Growth in the Boardman schools could mean more for teachers for next year, the Morrow County School Board was told Monday night.

Riverside High School Principal Dan Daltoso said that his school presently has 341 students enrolled, and that there may be as many as 50 more students next year.

"Our problem is one of numbers," Daltoso told the board in making a request to budget for two more teachers. "I think the justification for two new teachers is there, based on numbers alone." He said this year's senior class has 51 students, the juniors have 72, Sophomore class 86 and the freshman 94. He added that next year's in-coming freshman class could have 95 to 100 students.

The jump in enrollment could cause problems for the high school in that additional classes are needed in English, history, science, math, personal finance and citizenship. He also pointed out to the board that woodworking classes are full, and that changes in college requirements will force the school into adding classes in social studies.

The school board agreed with Daltoso, and voted to include the additional teachers in next year's proposed district budget.

Crowding at Sam Boardman Elementary school caused the principal there to request additional staff next year. Principal Susan Tolar asked the board to add either one full time teacher or two part-time aids at that school in next year's budget.

In other business, the board voted to adopt a policy against tobacco use on school grounds and at school functions. Previously the district had no policy against tobacco use.

voted to allow principals Susan and Mick Tolar to take an educational tour of England, Scotland and Wales next summer.

voted to go on record in support of the proposed Superconducting Supercollider, for which Boardman has been considered one of 25 sites throughout the U.S. Construction of the proposed facility could mean up to 3,500 new employees in the Boardman area, and would have tremendous impact on the county, and the school system.
