## Public hearing set to review data for proposed SSC sites

The Economic Development Department has contracted with CH2M Hill Northwest, Inc. to identify potential sites for the SSC through review of data and technical information supplied by agencies of the State of Oregon. These include Economic Development Department, Department of Energy, Department of Transportation, Department of Environmental Quality, Department of Land Conservation and Development, Water Resources Department, Division of State Lands, Department of Geology and Mineral Industries, University of Oregon and Oregon State University.

Representatives of these agencies serve on an oversight committee for this grant. Two agencies - the Division of State Lands and the Department of Higher Education - have contributed dollars to finance the first phase of CH2M Hill's work. The Economic Development Department is grant manager.

So far, CH2M Hill has completed an initial screening of potential sites evaluated according to the following criteria:

- Proximity to urban areas and universities.
- Tunneling costs.
- Land availability.
- Electric energy supply and cost.
- Transportation systems.
- Water supply.

Four sites were considered and eliminated - Christmas Valley, Catlow Valley, Burns, and Bend. Three sites have been retained for further study. They are: (1) in Umatilla and Morrow Counties near Boardman; (2) in the Willamette Valley between Portland and Salem; and (3) in the Willamette Valley between Corvallis and Eugene. A preliminary comparison of these three sites is now being evaluated.

Some of the characteristics that weighed in favor of the three sites include low water tables, strong and

stable bedrock, proximity to hydroelectric or coal fired energy plants, proximity to railroads and interstate highway intersections, water availability, mild climate, and proximity to population centers.

Further study will focus on engineering analyses to ascertain suitable methods of construction and related costs. A final report will be prepared for inclusion in a U.S. Department of Energy Atlas of Sites as Oregon's candidate for the construction of the Superconducting Super Collider.

The schedule for public hearing is: Monday, December 9, 1985, 7:30-10 p.m., Riverside High School Auditorium, 210 Boardman Avenue NE, Boardman, Oregon 97818.

The purpose of the hearing is to formally invite public comment on the Preliminary Comparison of Three Superconducting Super Collider Sites in Oregon, the report prepared by CH2M-Hill and distributed earlier this month.

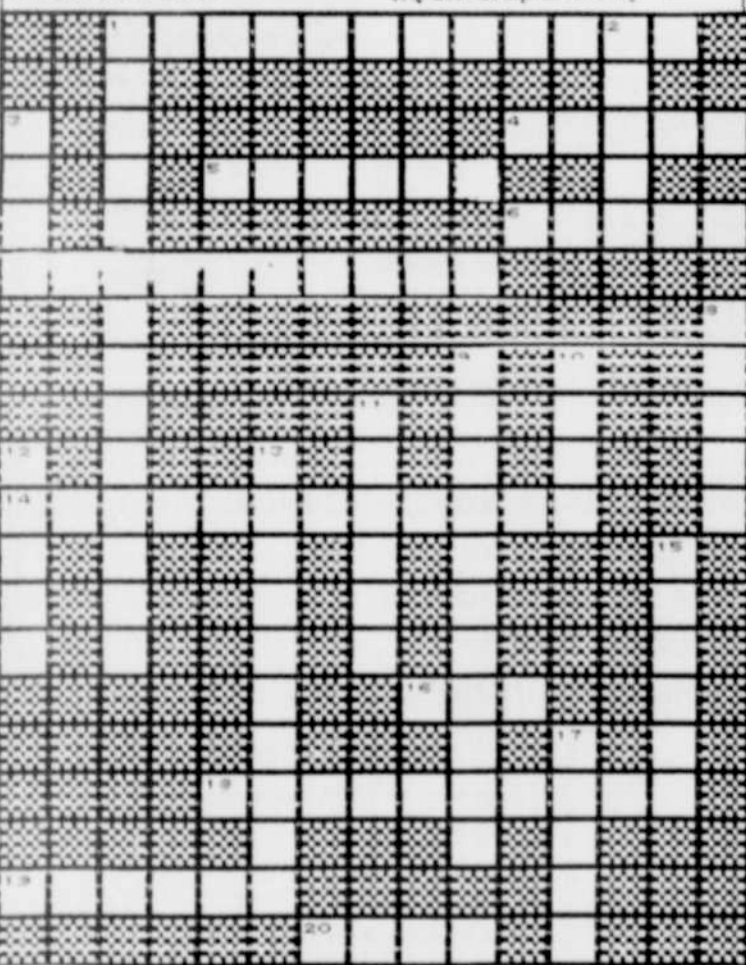
