

# Fillies take 1st place at Morrow invitational

Heppner hosted the Morrow County Invitational tournament Friday and Saturday Dec. 6 and 7. The Fillies finished the tournament receiving the championship trophy.

The Fillies' first game was Friday against the unknown Catlin-Gable team.

Starting for Heppner were guards Missy Turner and Dana Reid; forwards Lana Reid and Missy Eubanks and center Penny Connor.

Heppner took an early lead with the help of their fast breaks.

Lana Reid led the way for the Fillies as she put in 14 points.

The final score was Heppner 52 and Catlin-Gable 35. The win for the Fillies was a whole team effort as each member contributed.

"The starters played well in the first half. We were running the fast break well and we were having success with our half-court offense when we had to set up," said Coach Royer.

"In the second half our bench got a lot of playing which is important in pre-season," added Royer.

The win for the Fillies sent them to the championship game against the Riverside Pirates.

Riverside had beaten lone in the Friday afternoon game to advance to the championship game.

The Fillies started the same players in the Riverside game as they did against Catlin-Gable.

Heppner took a big lead in the first half, credit going to Heppner fast break and defense.

The Fillies held the Pirates down to only four points in both the first and second quarters while the Fillies had 18 in the first quarter and 15 in the second quarter.

Royer feels that Heppner's defense is going strong. "Our defense has looked good for this early in the season," said Royer, "but we have been getting into foul trouble and that's something we can't afford to do."

The other key to the Fillies' win over Riverside was the fastbreaks. Royer feels that the reason for that is that "we've controlled the boards."

The Pirates had trouble at the free throw line in the first half of the game, shooting 12 and not putting any in.

At the half-time buzzer, Heppner led the game with a 25 point lead. Heppner slowed down a bit in the third quarter but came back strong in the fourth quarter to win the game.

Lana Reid led the Fillies with 16 points and 18 rebounds, while Dana Reid put in 13 points. Missy Turner led the team with five assists.

Royer felt that the Fillies defense was a big asset in the game. "Our defense set the tempo of the game early," he commented.

In the consolation game Catlin-Gable came out above lone to win

the game.

The Fillies' next game is Saturday, Dec. 14 at Sherman County beginning at 6 p.m. The Fillies then return home to play Mac-Hi Tuesday, Dec. 17 at 8 p.m.
