Mustangs advance in tourney before being topped by Pioneers

Both the McLoughlin (Milton-Freewater) boys and girls basketball teams were champions of their second annual "I'll Be Home For Christmas" Tournament on Friday, Dec. 20 and Saturday, Dec. 21.

Heppner's boys basketball team advanced to the championship game before falling 46-40 to Mac-Hi. Heppner had advanced to the championship game with a 51-48 victory over Freeman, Washington, on Friday. Mac-Hi defeated Riverview, Washington, 38-41 to earn the right to meet Heppner. In the game for third place, Freeman routed Riverview.

The Mac-Hi girls prevailed 60-55 in overtime against West Valley, Washington, on Friday. Meanwhile, the Freeman girls topped Baker 32-35. Mac-Hi lopped Freeman to take the girls championship trophy, while West Valley bombed Baker for third place.

Below is a look at Heppner's tournament contests.

Heppner 51 Freeman 48
The Mustangs held off a furious

Scotty rally over the final three quarters to advance to the championship game against Mac-Hi. Heppner, with Todd Lindsay scoring nine first period points, used their fast break to jump out to a 12-4 lead.

Freeman crept back into the contest in the second frame to pull within 28-22 at intermission.

With Kirk Hansen and Matt Juppe connecting on jump shots from outside, the Scotties scored 12 third quarter points while holding the Mustangs to seven. Heppner's lead was cut to 35-34 entering the fourth period.

Down the stretch, Heppner scored key baskets and hit clutch free throws to nail down the win, 51-48.

The Mustangs shot 47 percent from the field, Freeman was nearly as effective as they were 22 of 48 for 46 percent. The Scotties shot 80 percent from the free throw line compared to 50 percent for Heppner. However, Heppner converted 13 of 26 shots, while the Scotties were just 4 of 5 and did not make a trip to the line in the second half.

Lindsay tossed in 19 points, leading all scorers. Tony Clement and Wayne Wilgers contributed 12 and 11 more respectively for the Mustangs. Topping Freeman were Hansen and Sean Lewis with 10 apiece.

Heppner snagged 30 rebounds against the taller Scotties starting line-up.

Lindsay and Wilgers each snared seven boards, while Keith Kenison grabbed six more. Duane Ball passed out six assists.

"Our win over Freeman gave us a lot of confidence heading into the championship game," replied coach Brent Eggers. He added, "We played our best under pressure."

Heppner 40 McLoughlin 46
The Pioneers topped the Mustangs 46-40 in the championship game.

Mac-Hi used their press early in the game and capitalized on 10 Heppner turnovers to grab a 12-6 advantage in the first quarter.

The Mustangs came back to make the score 19-16 at halftime with a 10-7 advantage in the second period. At halftime Heppner had committed 16 turnovers to just three for Mac-Hi. The Mustangs stayed in the game thanks to an 18-8 advantage on the boards.

In the third period, the Pioneers upped their lead to 31-26, but had led by as much as nine.

Mac-Hi remained in control of the game in the fourth quarter leading by as many as 11 points at times. Heppner narrowed the deficit to six points, but it wasn't enough as the Pioneers won 46-40.

Heppner shot a season-high 75 percent from the foul line, but attempted only eight shots, making six. From the floor Heppner shot 50 percent making 17 of 34 shots. Mac-Hi made 8 of 11 foul shots for 73 percent. Mac-Hi dumped in 19 of 53 tries from the field, 36 percent.

"We were unable to run our fast break like we want to because they (Mac-Hi) were just quicker than us," explained coach Brent Eggers. "Mac-Hi plays a gambling type of defense and we took too long to adjust

to it."
"Todd Lindsay had an outstanding weekend," noted Eggers. "Tony Clement also played strong for us both nights."

To cap things off, Lindsay was named to the all-tournament team along with Carlton and Cockburn. Other named to the all-tournament team were Kirk Hansen of Freeman and John Kimsey of Riverview.

"Even though Carlton scored 16 points against us I felt we did a good job on Carlton," stated Eggers. "Overall we played very well in the tournament."

Heppner now stands at 3-3 on the season and Eggers is pleased with his team's attitude. "The kids were very disappointed they lost this tournament," he added. "They go out and think they can win every game which is something last year's team couldn't do."

The Mustangs will meet Mac-Hi again on Saturday, Jan. 4 in Heppner at 7:30 p.m. Following that matchup, Heppner will open league play against Riverside in Boardman on Friday, Jan. 10 and at Stanfield on Saturday, Jan. 11. Both games start at 7:30 p.m.
