

Fillies remain undefeated Last game is exciting one

The Fillies shot the ball well, according to coach Mike Royer. "We shot the ball well and played with a lot of intensity, especially in the fourth quarter," said coach Royer. "It could easily have been a game where we could have relaxed and let down, but we didn't. We played hard, it was a good game for us."

Missy Turner led the Fillies in assists with 9. Lana Reid had 6 steals

while Dana Reid and Turner each stole the ball 4 times.

The Fillies travel to Weston-McEwen Friday, Feb. 21 and trun around and host the Tiger-Scots on Saturday.

"I'm sure Weston-McEwen will be tough, especially at home," said Royer. "It's a game they need to win badly, so it should be a good test for us."

In their last game of the season Saturday, Feb. 15, the Ione Cardinals suffered yet another loss, and their third at the hands of the Condon Blue Devils. Dave Anderson and Scott Miller score 19 and 17 points respectively to pace the Blue Devil attack. Sophomore guard Ken Snider scored a career high 26 points to take game high honors.

For the Cardinals, the 75-55 loss was their 19th of the season. Even though they had their highest scoring output of the season, the Cards were unable to slow down the hot shooting Devils.

Ione trailed by only four at the half but was unable to catch up to Condon in the second half.

Ione freshman Dustin Padberg pulled in 14 rebound., both a personal career and season high, plus the most by any Ione player for the year. Ione's three graduating seniors Rod Taylor, Jerry Anderson and

Eric Pointer could only manage to combine for 8 points in their last game, including a last second shot by Pointer at the buzzer.

Ione finished with a 1-19 overall record. Their only win came at home against Wheeler by two points, 42-40.

Snider led Ione in scoring for the year averaging 123 points per game and Padberg led with 83 rebounds.

Heppner's freshmen boys basketball team ended their season with a dramatic 47-45 victory over the Pilot Rock Rockets on Tuesday, Feb. 11.

The Mustangs concluded their season with a 6-6 record under first-year coach John Boyer. Heppner had its troubles early in the season, losing its first four games.

The season-ending win for the Mustangs was mired in controversy.

As the horn sounded ending the game the scoreboard read 45-45. However as the scorebooks were added up it was discovered Heppner had won 47-45.

The Mustangs struggled in the first half and fell behind 30-12 at intermission.

Pilot Rock capitalized on the Mustang's foul problems during the first two quarters hitting 16 of 19 free throws.

It was Heppner's turn to score 15 points in the third period, but the Mustang's still trailed by 12, going into the fourth quarter. Chet Hall had all of the Rockets' nine points in the period, hitting five of six at the foul line.

Heppner managed to come back in the fourth period. Mike Corea and Tim Hays hit clutch charity shots to pull out the victory.

"We played terribly in the first half, but were able to turn that around in the second half," remarked coach Boyer.

Besides Devin, Lindsay, and Padberg, Heppner also received significant contributions from Angell, Martin, and Mike Mahoney.

The Cardinals were led in scoring by Deena Hams with 10 point and Sandi Wright with 8 points. Karla Davison and Patti McElligott were the leading rebounders with 6 and 4 respectively. Candi Rudisill played an aggressive defensive game and made 5 steals.
