



Grange plans women's activities

The committee on women's activities for Wheatland Pomona Grange District No. 29 met at Willows Grange Hall on Wednesday for a yearly conference. Presiding was Geri Martin, chair of the Wheatland Pomona. She introduced Verla Larson District No. 4, chairman from Portland. Dorris Reid, District No. 6 chairman was also introduced. The ladies gave a good report on the state grange session of last year.

The cookies that were left over after the judging were given to nursing homes, as were some of the lovely centerpieces. They are asking members to enter more breads and cookies at the state session. Always remember to enter 13 cookies as the one cookie more than the dozen is the one judged. Be sure to seal cookies in a plastic bag, have the name address, and the Grange you are associated with enclosed in the package.

The breads entered must have the recipe enclosed. If you enter a whole grain bread you must have the name of the wheat. You can grind your own wheat for this purpose.

The dress contest is going at the present time. One must use a Simplicity pattern, and the trimmings are optional. Many of the companies present prizes. Be sure you read carefully all the directions for the contests. The sewing contest will be judged May 6, 7, 8 and the Needlework contest October 7, 8, 9 in Lane County.

The State project for the deaf is most important and \$1,400 is being presented to the Umatilla County deaf project for use for the deaf project. The Grange has already presented several machines in that area. The Grange also sponsors the Dogs for the Deaf project which trains dogs and gives to those needing this animal.

Care project this year is for water for life, to purchase supplies such as pumps and pipes for Indonesia. It is interesting to note that 95 percent of the money collected actually goes to the Care project.

The CWA \$200 scholarship is also presented at the CWA breakfast at the State session. Recognition reports for getting reports in on time were presented to Greenfield Grange, Mikkalo, Lexington, Rufus, and Rhea Creek. There are 46 granges in the District of Mrs. Larson.
