Coffee Day to benefit Easter Seals

The annual Easter Seals' Coffee Day will be held on March 21 with local restaurants selling Coffee Day buttons two weeks prior to the event.

The Coffee Day buttons sell for \$1 each and entitle the customer to a bottomless cup of coffee on Friday, March 21. The buttons go on sale on

March 7.

Cindee Henderson, local chairperson, said that the dollars realized from the sale of buttons will help fund Easter Seal Society services to 8,000 Oregonian children and adults with physical disabilities. An average of 95 cents out of each dollar donated stays in Oregon. Easter Seal programs include warm water therapeutic-recreational swimming, physical, occupational, speech and language therapies, the Easter Seal camp, equipment services, clinics and a variety of related programs.

Participating restaurants are donating coffee. Among the local area restaurants participating are: Cal's Restaurant, Wagon Wheel Cafe, Kate's Pizza & Pastry, Heppner Bowl, and R&W Drive-In in Heppner; V & G Restaurant in Lexington; and Beechers Cafe in Ione.

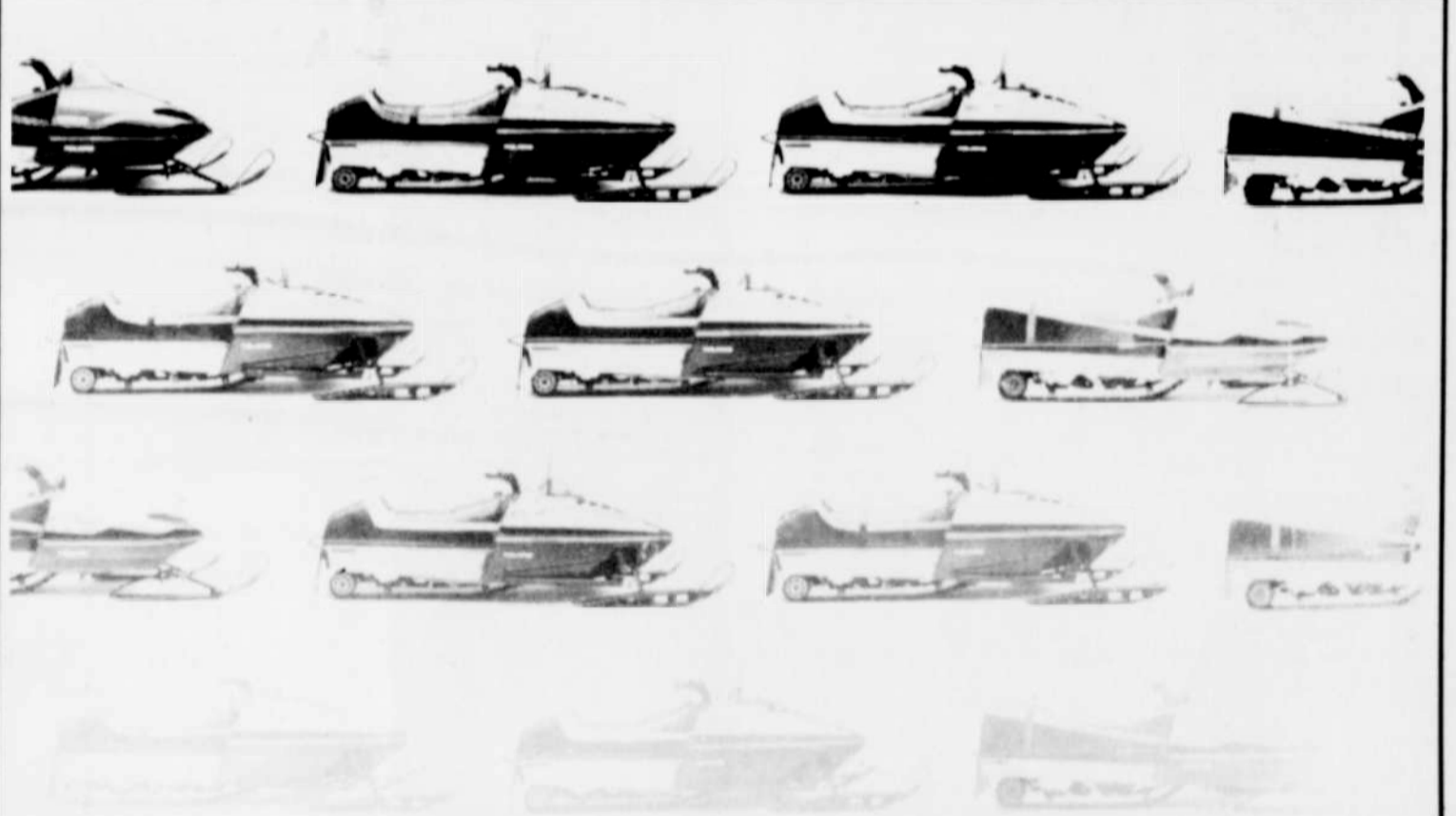
