SHALL MORROW COUNTY LEVY \$3381,694 OUTSIDE THE TAX BASE FOR PIONEER MEMORIAL HOSPITAL OPERATIONS DURING THE FISCAL YEAR 1986-87.

SHALL MORROW COUNTY LEVY \$2,568,731 OUTSIDE THE TAX BASE FOR OPERATING PURPOSES DURING FISCAL YEAR 1986-87?

The purpose of this levy is to provide funds to balance the Morrow County operating budget which includes: General Fund, Road Fund, County School Fund, Cities portion of Road Funds, Fair & Rodeo Fund, plus, the North Morrow Ambulance and North Morrow Medical Clinic Funds for 1986-87. The tax base for 1986-87 is \$322,000. The total levy will be \$3,118,874, which includes six percent for taxes not expected to be received and also includes \$28,143 for Lifeguard Medical Transport previously approved by the voters. 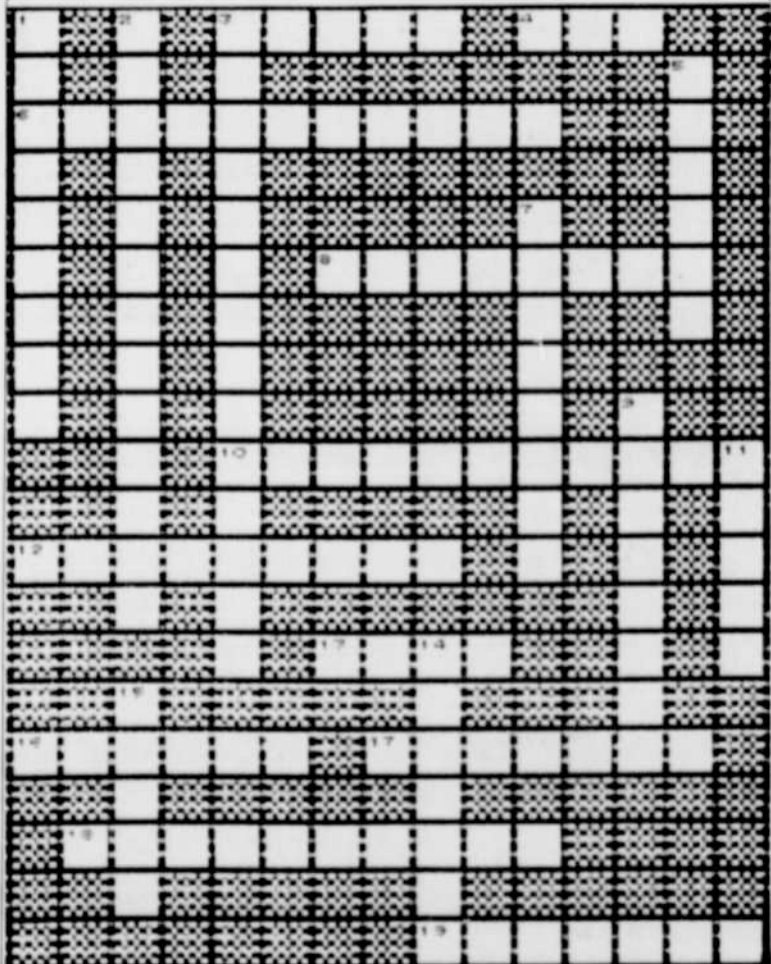
