See Halley's Comet at Goldendale park

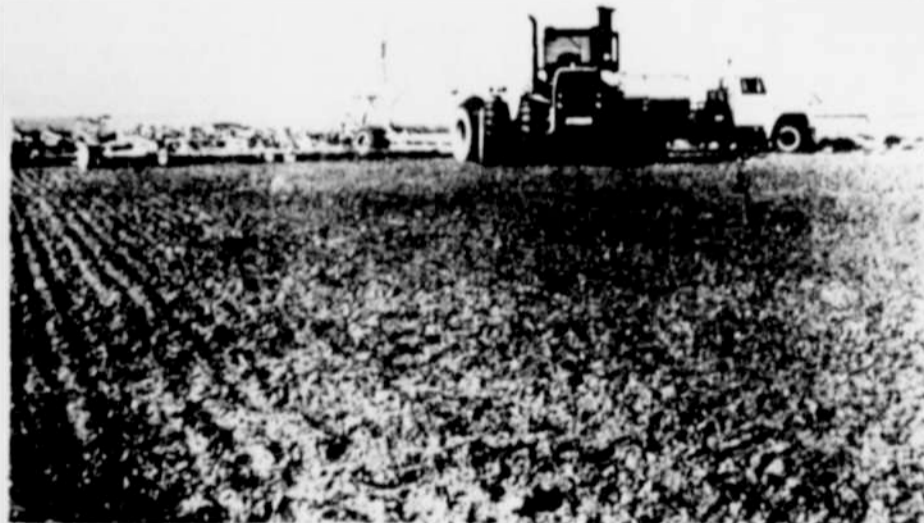

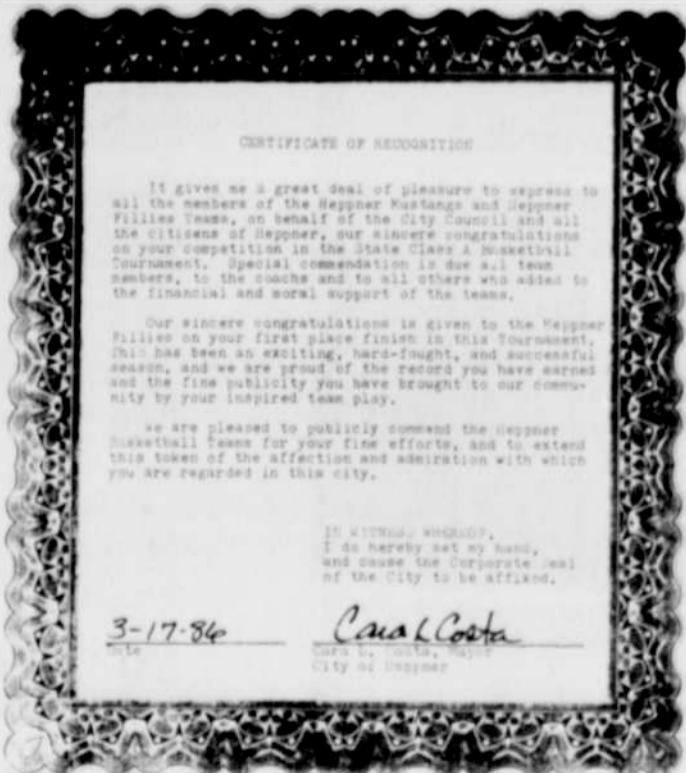
