NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY OF ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT Willow Creek (Cecil) Bridge County Road 546 Morrow County, Oregon

An Environmental Assessment has been prepared by Morrow County, the Oregon State Highway Division, and the Federal Highway Administration for the proposed replacement of the Willow Creek (Cecil) Bridge in Morrow County, on County Road 546. The project would replace the existing structurally deficient bridge, and the road approach on the east side of Willow Creek would also be realigned and raised.
