Even if you missed the first session on soil preparation, come Saturday and pick up a few pointers on gardening from these local experts.

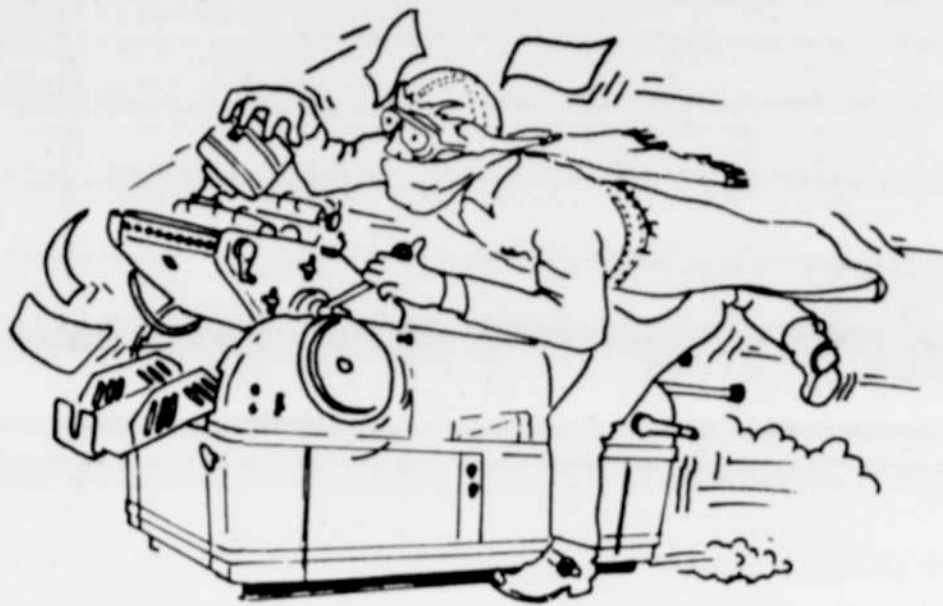
