

Boys place fifth in field of 25

Heppner's boys track team placed fifth in a 25 team field at the Morrow County Invitational on Saturday, April 12. The boys scored 45 points, while the Heppner girls did not score. Union won the boys title with 67 points; Sherman County took the girls title, accumulating 65 points.

Pacing the Mustangs was freshman Bryan Padberg, who continued his onslaught on the record book. He set freshmen class records in the 800 meter run, in which he was second in 2:05.5 and the 1500 meter run which he ran in 4:20.8. Padberg's 1500 meter time is also a new Class "A" all-time freshman record. "Bryan had super times, especially for a freshman," said head coach Dale Conklin.

In the distance races, Missy Gates was second in the 3000 in 16:39.5 and Michelle Beck was fourth in the 1500 at 6:28.9.

Thrower Shannon McLaughlin hurled the discus 70'8" for third and put the shot 22'6" for fifth.

Heppner competed in a four-way meet with Echo, Lone, and Riverside on Tuesday, April 15, but results were unavailable at press time.

On Saturday, April 19 Heppner will travel to John Day for the Grant Union Invitational which is slated to start at 11 a.m.

Jason Palmer also had a good day as he won the discus, tossing it 136'8". Palmer also put the shot 38'5" to crack into Heppner's all-time top 10 rankings in the event.

Wayne Wilgers leaped a season's best 6'2" to tie for third in the high jump. He also competed in the triple jump.

Ashley Conklin leaped to a pair of fourth place finishes in the long jump and triple jump. Conklin bounded 19'5 1/2" and 39'4" respectively.

Jason Dougherty sprinted to a fourth place finish in the 100 meter dash with a time of :12.4. Dougherty also ran the 200 meter dash in :25.9 and was on the 400 meter relay team of Jim Brosnan, Barney Lindsay, and Marty Brannon that ran :49.8.

Scott Buschke high jumped 5'10", but fell short of placing as all six place finishers cleared at least six feet.

Brannon threw the javelin 116'5" and ran the 400 meters in a season's best time of :58.5.

Lindsay long jumped 17'8 1/2", ran the 100 meter in :12.6, and the 200 meter in :25.7.

Chris McLaughlin competed in both the 110 meter high hurdles and 300 meter intermediate hurdles. McLaughlin had times of :19.5 and a season's best time of :46.8 respectively.

"We faced some really good competition and I'm pleased with where we finished," said Conklin.

Evidence of that competition came in the boys long jump where Helix's Jim Porter set a new all-time Class "A" record with a phenomenal leap of 23'6".

Despite not scoring the girls team got good things from freshmen distance runners Nance Wright and Michelle Beck.

Wright had a personal best of 2:50.3 in the 800. Beck took 1:30.2 off her previous best in the 3,000 meter run to finish with a time of 13:02.8.

Kim Wright had a personal best in 100 high hurdles with a time of

:21.1. In the same race, Dorothy Hays was just short of placing in :20.2.

The two Wrights, Hays, and Stacey Kennedy ran :59.4 in the sprint relay.

Jill Conklin and Sandra Wattenburger each cleared 4'4" in the high jump. Conklin long jumped 13'0 1/2" and Wattenburger 12'3".

Shannon McLaughlin put the shot

20'10 1/2", and threw the discus 68'9".

Also competing in the 1500 were Cathy Martin and Missy Gates.

Heppner thinclads bested by Riverside

Despite a strong showing in the field events, Heppner's boys track team finished second to Riverside in a four-way meet on Tuesday, April 8. Heppner had 84 points, just behind Riverside with 92 points. Other teams in the meet were Umatilla, with 37 points, and Lone with 25 points.

Paced by the double wins of Ashley Conklin and Jason Palmer, the Heppner boys team won every field event except the javelin and pole vault en route to the second place finish.

Conklin leaped 20'5 1/2" in the long jump and 40'5 1/2" in the triple jump, both first place finishes. Conklin was also on the second place 1600 meter relay team of Chris

McLaughlin, Jim Brosnan, and Trent Harrison that ran 4:06.

Palmer captured the shot put, heaving 37 feet and the discus, throwing 134 feet.

Wayne Wilgers also had a banner day in the field. He cleared 5'10" to win the high jump and jumped a personal best 38'2" to earn second in the triple jump. Wilgers also competed in the long jump.

Harrison was second in the 1500 meters running 4:48.9. McLaughlin earned seconds in the 110 meter high hurdles at :19.5 and in the 300 meter intermediate hurdles at :49.2.

Bryan Padberg had a first in the 3000 meter run with a time of 10:36.3 and was second in the 800 meter run in 2:18.4.

Brosnan competed in the 100 and

was on the second place 400 meter relay team of Marty Brannon, Barney Lindsay, and Jason Dougherty that ran :51.5.

Scott Buschke also competed in the 100, but did more damage in the field events. He was second in the high jump at 5'8" and had a personal best of 37'1 1/2" in the triple jump.

Lindsay added two third place finishes to his relay performance. He jumped a personal best 18'9 1/2" in the long jump and ran 1:03.3 for 400 meters.

Dougherty was second with a personal best of :12.0 in the 100 and was fourth in the 200 with a time of
