Comet may be seen in evening sky

Spring and Summer hours are now in effect at the Goldendale Observatory through the end of September. Wednesday through Sunday, visitors are welcome from 1 to 5 p.m. and 7 p.m. to 3 a.m.

For the week of April 16 - April 20, Halley's comet rises at 8:30 p.m. Telescope viewing under clear skies should reveal the moon, the planets, Venus, Mars, Saturn, and Uranus, the bright star Regulus, the double star Cor Caroli, the open star cluster M44, the globular star cluster M13.

"ABC Astronomy," the portion of the program dedicated to words and phrases, will explain obliquity.

During "The Stars Tonight," observers will identify the constellation Centaurus.

And during "Practical Astronomy," visitors in the theater will see demonstrations about orbiting satellites.

On Tuesday noon, April 22, many

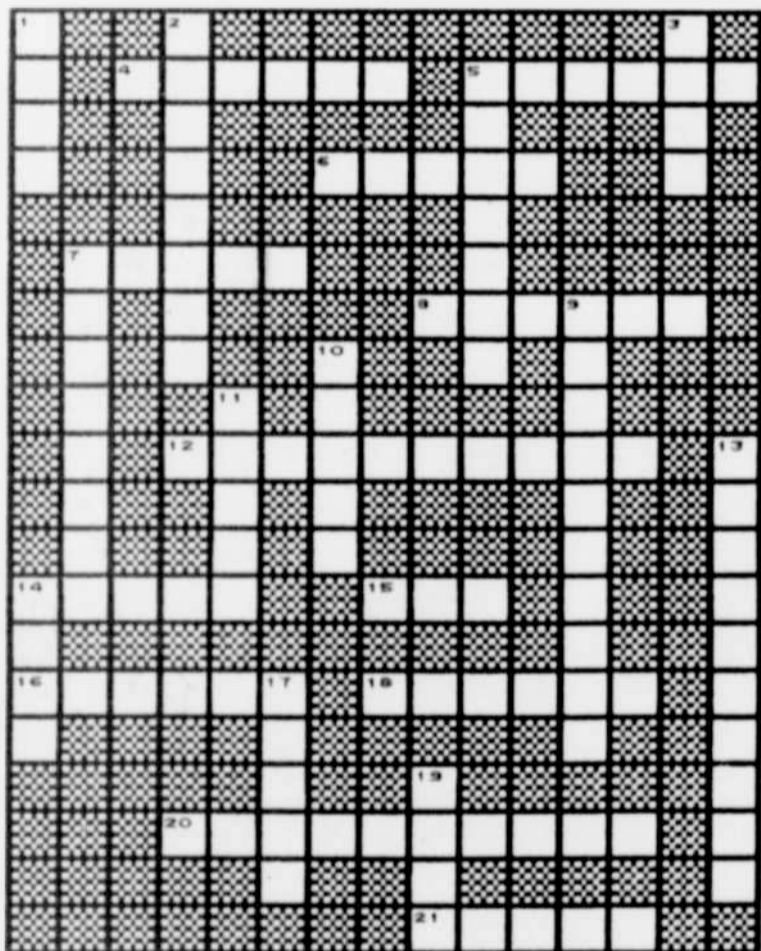
