Since it was introduced to retailers nine months ago, the red meat industry's effort to bring new nutritional information to the meat case-Meat Nutri-facts-has become one of the most successful retail programs in the history of the meat industry.

As of this writing 36 of the top 50 retail chains and eight of the top 11 wholesalers in the U.S. are now using this program. The Meat Nutri-Facts campaign has become one of the beef industry's most successful demand building efforts of all time.

The Oregon Beef Council has further reinforced the Nutri-Facts concept with its new marketing program that features 4-color case cards and consumer recipes with the Meat Nutri-Facts information on them. 350 of Oregon's largest grocery stores including 105 Safeway stores are providing this information for their customers. Other Oregon trail food stores who are cooperating with the Beef Council in this program include Albertson's, Fred Meyer, Kienow's, Thriftway, IGA, Sentry Markets and a number of small independents. It is hoped that by July we will have more than 600 retail food stores in Oregon involved in the Meat Nutri-Facts program.

In addition to the retail programs, efforts are being made to update local nutritionists with the new meat data. Dianne Byrne, Oregon Beef Council Home Economist, recently gave a presentation to the Portland Dietetic Association on the revision of USDA meat data and the role of beef in a healthy diet.

"I think retailers and wholesalers feel a responsibility to provide consumers with the latest nutritional information about red meat," states Donald Ostensoe, Manager, Oregon Beef Council. "With this information, their customers can make a more informed buying decision-which is good for the consumer and the store."

According to Dr. John Farquhar, head of Stanford University's Heart Disease Program, the Nutri-Facts program has a lot to offer. "I think they (the meat industry) are being very smart, realizing that people are much more likely to continue eating meat if they feel in control if they know just how much fat and cholesterol they are getting in each serving and can adjust the rest of their food intake accordingly," Farquhar said. "(We should) be grateful for a meat industry that is making life a little easier."

District Attorney's Report

Wilson Enters Plea

Charged with murdering Boardman resident Beth Williams, Jerry Joe Wilson, 27, Baker, entered a plea of not guilty before the Honorable Judge William Jackson in Baker County Circuit Court.

Wilson's defense attorney Ralph Smith withdrew a motion for a psychiatric evaluation he requested at Wilson's arraignment April 11.

Wilson is accused of bludgeoning Williams to death by Baker County District Attorney Ken Hadley. A preliminary autopsy report indicated that Williams died of massive head injuries.

Hadley said a rock was found near the site where Williams body was buried and the prosecution suspects it to be the murder weapon. However, he stressed, lab reports are not in to substantiate that.

According to Hadley the defense filed a Motion to Suppress asking that certain evidence not be allowed at a later trial. That hearing is scheduled for Wednesday, April 30.

Wilson has not yet requested bail and is still being held in the Baker County Jail.
