Time to make your Wheat cake

Follow these easy rules using the official 1986 "Oregon Apple-Walnut Cake" recipe.

1. The cake baking contest will be held at the Morrow County Fair and cakes will be exhibited and judged at fair.

2. Contestants must be a resident of the county in which he/she enters.

3. Each contestant must use the same 1986 Oregon Apple-Walnut Cake recipe with Filling as listed.

4. The fair book will list the time and date your entry should be in place.

5. Any person over age 18 may enter; however, professional bakers are excluded.

6. After the cakes are judged at the county fairs, the contestant may take at least 3/4 of his/her cake home leaving 1/4 on display for the remainder of the fair.

7. All cakes must be brought to the fair on a covered board or cardboard.

8. Premium awards for the winners will be paid by the Oregon Wheat Growers League upon notification by the extension agent or fair office. Premium awards are: first, \$10; second, \$5; and third, \$3.

9. No substitutions, additions, or deletions will be allowed to the official recipe.

Oregon Apple-Walnut Cake

1. cup butter or margarine

2 cups granulated sugar

2 eggs

1 teaspoon baking powder

1/2 teaspoon salt

2 cups sifted cake flour

1 cup cultured sour cream

1 tablespoon vanilla

-Powdered Sugar--

Filling

Mix together:

1 cup finely chopped walnuts

1 cup peeled, diced apples

2 tablespoons brown sugar

1 tablespoon cinnamon

Cream butter and sugar. Add

eggs, one at a time, beating well

after each one. Sift dry ingredients

together. Add alternately with sour

cream and vanilla mixture. Put half

of the batter in bottom of greased

and lightly floured 10" bundt pan. Put

in filling and cover with remaining

batter. Bake at 350° for 1 hour. Cool

5-10 minutes and turn out of pan.

Dust lightly with powdered sugar.

No filling should show on finished

cake.

Heppner wood cutting season opens June 2

Those wanting to gather firewood from the Heppner District must wait until June 2 for their woodcutting outing reports the Forest Service's Northwest region office.

Woodcutters who gather firewood on the Umatilla National Forest began the job of laying in next winter's supply of wood May 1 with the opening of the 1986 Firewood Season. Wood permits went on sale at Ranger District offices in Walla Walla and Ukiah, and at the Forest Supervisor's Office in Pendleton.

The season is delayed until May 12 for woodcutters depending on firewood in the Pomeroy Ranger District.

Demand for firewood is expected to remain high this summer continues the region office press release. Last year, over 10,000 permits allowed the removal of nearly 63,000 cords of firewood from the Umatilla National Forest.

According to Phil Kline, timber staff officer, the Umatilla will continue to supply firewood at about the same amounts.

"But the firewood available will not be as desirable, and it will not be as easy to find in the future," Kline warns.

Firewood permits may be purchased in person or by mail. A driver's license number or other identification which provides applicant's name, address, and telephone

number is needed for identification.

Woodcutters must buy at least \$10 or 4 cords of firewood priced at \$2.50 per cord. Maximum firewood allowed per household is 10 cords, also at \$2.50 per cord. This maximum limit includes both charge and free use firewood removed during the current season.

A valid woodcutting permit includes a set of woodcutting area maps, color-coded truckload tickets, and your permit. A truckload ticket must be attached to each 1/2 cord load of firewood removed from National Forest Land.

Firewood cutting areas will open and close at varying times this season. Many areas shown on firewood maps may not be accessible by vehicle until mid-June, lower elevation areas will open first. Woodcutters should check the nearest Ranger District to learn current road conditions. Some roads to woodcutting areas are unpaved, narrow, and dusty.

Only dead material may be removed. Permits contain information about cutting standing dead trees in specific areas. However, standing dead trees marked with paint or signed as wildlife reserve trees, cannot be cut, regardless of location.

Permits will be available at the Heppner District office beginning June 2. Cutting areas will open on June 2.

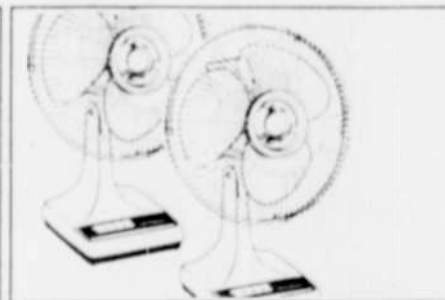

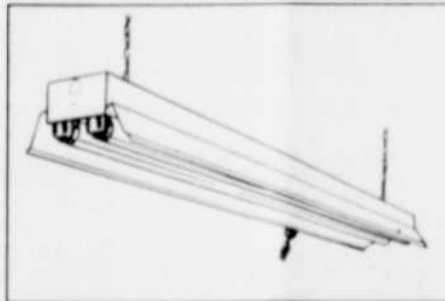

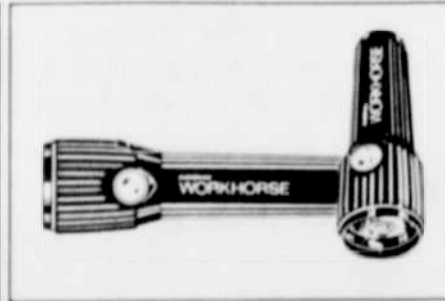
