Voter registration needs cutoff date

To the Editor:

In the last legislative session the bill requiring a 20 day voter registration cutoff did not pass. Disregarding the will of their constituents, legislators instead passed a law allowing people to register up to 5 p.m. the day before an election with acceptable proof of residence.

In my opinion, the new voter registration law is "a joke." The so-called proof of residence required by the Secretary of State is really no proof at all.

The present 20 day residence requirement for voters should be back-

ed up by a 20 day voter registration cutoff. Oregonians in Action, 1533 E. Burnside, Portland, 97214, (233-1231) is sponsoring a petition for this purpose. Let's stop the confusion in the mail to OIA Now. With your immediate help, we will have enough signatures to get the 20 day voter registration cutoff on the November ballot so Oregon voters can require this constitutional change.
