Columbia Basin Electric Coop has announced its Residential Weatherization Program is still in effect according to Jerry Healy, representative for CBEC. Under this program, certain electrically space heated homes are eligible for weatherization measures found to be cost effective. Cost effectiveness is determined by an energy audit provided by the Coop.

Funding for the program is provided through a "buy back" arrangement with the Bonneville Power Administration for the estimated kilowatt-hours that can be saved through weatherization.
