-One State FFA Convention involving five members.

-One National FFA Convention involving three members.

-One Computers in Agriculture Award involving one member.

-Two Agricultural Essay competitions involving six members.

-One Ag Cooperative Quiz contest involving one member.

Collectively the chapter earned six first place, 13 second place, and four third place finishes in the above individual and team competitions.

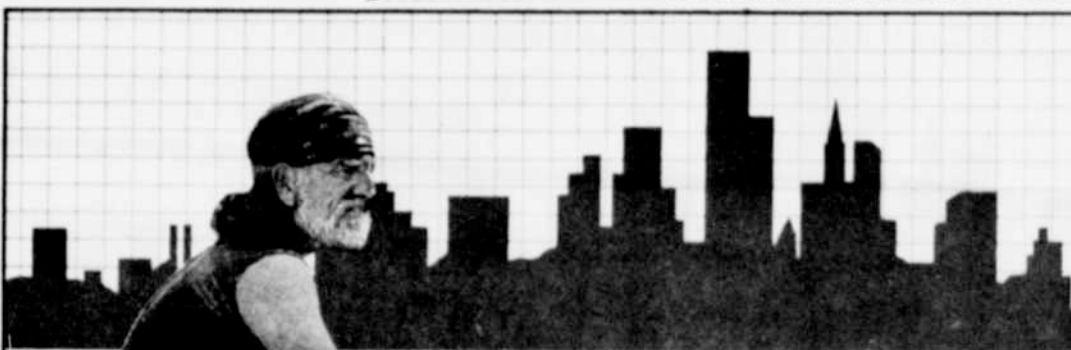
First Interstate Bank employees who serve as clerks and recorders of the sales.

Anyone may bid and buy the animals. Plan to be in the front row and ready to start your bid at 8 p.m. Friday night, August 15. There'll be top quality beef, sheep and hogs coming through the auction.

There'll be an eager, hopeful, boy or girl leading them through, and the Livestock Growers will be there seeing that all goes well with the sale.
