Floyd W. Zimmerman

Floyd W. Zimmerman, 59, owner operator of the Shamrock Club in Fossil, died Saturday, August 2, 1986 from injuries received in a car accident near Cascade Locks.

He was born September 30, 1926, in Rochester, Minn., the son of Erwin and Alma Zimmerman.

He owned and operated the Shamrock Club for 32 years. He built Zim's Brau Haus in The Dalles and had operated it since 1970. He also owned and operated numerous other businesses in the Portland area over the past 40 years.

He was a charter member of the Hillsboro Elks Lodge, and was always community minded.

He is survived by five children, Kristy Brown, Bend; Phillip Zimmerman, Fossil; Shari Espy, Stockton, California; Terry Fleming, Portland; Michael O'Brien, The Dalles; 16 grandchildren; two brothers, Kermit Zimmerman, Portland, and Norman Zimmerman, St. Paul, Minnesota.

Cryptside services were held today, (Wednesday) August 6, 1986, at Lincoln Memorial Cemetery, 10500 S.E. Mt. Scott Blvd., Portland.

A memorial service is scheduled Saturday, August 9, 1986, at 1 p.m. at the Fossil School gymnasium.

Blaine E. Isom

Balme E. "Bill" Isom, 83, died Monday July 28, 1986 at Delamarter Care Center. He had been a resident there since a stroke in 1984.

Isom was born in Brownville, Ore., March 16, 1903, one of 19 brothers and sisters born to Sarah (Worthington) and Sewell T. Isom. When he was 17, he moved to Heppner to work on a ranch managed by his brother-in-law. He stayed on there and worked with the Standard Oil Company before finally forming his own insurance business in 1938.

In 1935 he married Evelyn Struve of Pendleton. Two daughters were born in Heppner. One has since died.

When Henry Struve, his father-in-law, died in 1947, Isom took over farming the Struve land 10 miles west of Pendleton, and continued until retiring at age 70.

Isom was a life member of the Oregon Wheat Growers League. He was active in Heppner and Pendleton as a member of the Elks 288, Ruth Locust Chapter 32 OES; Heppner Masonic Lodge 69; Royal Arch Masons Heppner Chapter 26; Knights Templar Commandery 7; and Al Kader Temple AAONMS of

Portland. He served as worthy patron of the Eastern Star in Heppner, and president of the Shrine Clubs in Heppner and Pendleton.

He organized a DeMolay Chapter in Heppner and in Pendleton worked many years with Job's Daughters, Bethel 12. As long as the games were held in Pendleton, he and his wife

were escorts for the queens of the East-West Shrine Football games. Through the years he was instrumental in sending many Eastern Oregon crippled children for treatment.

Isom was active in founding the Pendleton Community Hospital, serving many years on its board.

Survivors include his wife, Evelyn, of Pendleton; daughter Harriet of Vientiane, Laos; brothers Leighton of Portland and Dorsey of Salem; and sister Imogene Shea of Portland.

Funeral service was Thursday, July 31 at Olney Cemetery Mausoleum in Pendleton.
