

## Sheriff's Report

The Morrow County Sheriff's Office at the Morrow County Courthouse in Heppner reports handling or dispatching the following business during the past week:

August 18 - the Morrow County Sheriff's Office responded to Gourmet Brands, Inc. after receiving a complaint of subjects refusing to leave the premises.

August 19 - the Sheriff's Office dispatched a Boardman ambulance to the Shell Service Station in response to a report of a male subject with an illness. He was transported to Good Shepherd Hospital in Hermiston.

August 19 - the Sheriff's Office backed up the Boardman Police Dept. at the Hitchin' Post in Boardman after receiving a complaint of a person causing trouble.

August 19 - the Sheriff's Office took a report of a stolen 1982 Datsun King Cab with an Oregon license. Vehicle was allegedly stolen from Ed Shook's residence on Root Lane between 7 a.m. and 8:30 p.m. Vehicle is valued at approximately \$3,000. Investigation is continuing.

August 19 - the Heppner Police Dept. arrested Danna L. Hauska, 36, lone, for alleged Assault IV. Hauska was released on his own recognizance.

August 20 - the Sheriff's Office responded to the Wagon Wheel Addition in Irrigon after receiving a complaint of a possible domestic fight. Investigation is continuing.

August 20 - the Sheriff's Office located an abandoned vehicle on I-84 at the Jct. of Hwy. 730 that had been stripped. The sheriff's office is attempting to locate the owners.

August 22 - a Morrow County Deputy assisted the Irrigon Police Dept. in locating two picnic tables. The two tables were taken from the East end of the Irrigon Marina and relocated in the Columbia River, approximately eight feet down. Morrow County Search and Rescue diving equipment was used to recover the tables. Investigation continues.

## PUBLIC NOTICE

PROCLAMATION

REGULATED CLOSURE

WHEREAS, the following described forest land has been determined by the State Forester of Oregon to be particularly exposed to fire danger:

All lands protected by the Central Oregon District of the Eastern Oregon Forest Protection District; the Deschutes National Forest; the Ochoco National Forest including the Crooked River National Grasslands and excluding the Snow Mountain Ranger District; and the North Central Oregon Forest Protection District within Regulated Use area 72R.

Detailed area map attached.

Descriptions and maps of the above area are on file in the State Forester's office, Salem, Oregon, and at the district headquarters office of the forest protection district.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, FRED ROBINSON, Assistant State Forester of Oregon, by virtue of the authority vested in me under the provisions of ORS 477.535 to 477.550, do hereby proclaim and designate said described land under Regulated Closure, and except as to the owner's right of entry on his own land, declare the entry thereon unlawful unless entrants comply with all of the following requirements and restrictions.

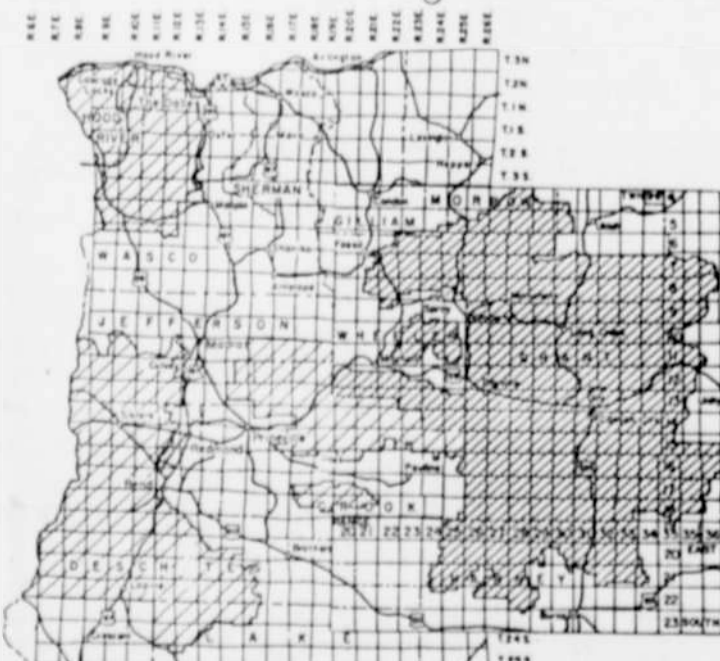
- Smoking is prohibited while traveling in timber, brush, or grass areas except in vehicles on roads and smoking is prohibited while working or traveling in an operation area.
- The above listed lands are hereby closed to building a camp, cooking, warming or other open fire, including charcoal fires, except at posted and designated campgrounds. Portable cooking stoves using liquified or bottled fuels are permissible.
- Non-industrial use of chain saws in timber, grass or brush areas is prohibited between the hours of 1:00 PM and 8:00 PM. Axe, shovel and fire extinguisher of 8 oz. capacity must be kept with each powersaw except on the Ochoco National Forest, including Crooked River National Grasslands, where all non-industrial use of chain saws is prohibited.
- All motorized vehicles, including motorcycle and all terrain vehicles, are restricted to improved roads\* except those on industrial operations under permit and those used in agricultural work.
- Have the following equipment for extinguishing fires, while traveling in timber, brush, or grass, except when traveling on public roads:
  - One axe not less than 26 inches in length overall, with head weighing 2 pounds or over.
  - One shovel not less than 26 inches in length overall, with blade not less than 8 inches wide.
  - One water container of at least one gallon filled to capacity or a 2 1/2 pound fire extinguisher fully charged.

\* Improved road: a road that has been constructed for automotive use and is maintained clear of flammable debris.

This proclamation shall be effective at 12:01 AM, PDT, August 14, 1986, and shall remain in full force and effect until terminated by similar order of the State Forester.
