

Driver license appearance changes

Oregon driver's license will change October 1 -- the last of several changes in recent weeks as the result of a new computer system and the conversion to classified driver licenses.

This summer changes were made primarily to the way driver information was arranged on the card. Next month the changes will be more obvious. There are three key changes, according to Dennis Rice, manager of driver licensing.

The background color behind the photos of licenses will become red, the name and title of the DMV administrator will no longer appear on the license and overlap the photo and data card. A light gold state seal and the word "Oregon" will be printed on the face of the card.

The change to one background color for all drivers has several advantages, Rice says. It saves time for DMV employees and eliminates the possibility of mistakenly posing a driver who is under 21 in front of a yellow background--the background which has been used for drivers 21 and older. The red background also is a better color for most people to be photographed against.

The use of a blue background for drivers under 21 was used to make it easier for people who sell alcohol to spot an under-age driver. Rice says DMV's new computer system allows the division to include a statement on the face of the license which states exactly when a driver will become 21. That way, he says, there will be no doubt.

The laminates which have been used to encase licenses have a blue "Oregon" along the left margin. That will be replaced by the gold "Oregon" across the face of the card. Rice says the new laminate also will have some new codes to describe the state's new classified licenses which will take effect October 1.

Licenses issued before that date will remain valid until the driver's next in-person renewal at a field office. Police and others who use driver licenses to help establish identity will be notified of the changes, Rice said.

Authorizing and Establishing Soil and Water Conservation/Weed District Tax Base. Question: Shall Morrow County SWCD/Weed Control District become a taxing district and establish \$93,000 tax base effective fiscal year 1987-88.

Explanation: Tax base will provide technical services to help control and eradicate noxious weeds; provide water resources; control flooding; improve water quality; improve fish and wildlife habitat; increase timber production; build diversion ditches; grassed waterways and install tile drainage and develop recreation.

Tax base will help the district maintain education and soils information programs. It will enable the district to obtain matching funds and apply for project and grant monies.

Approval of the base would result in maximum estimated rate of \$.12/\$1,000 assessed value. Estimated cost is \$7.20 for property assessed at \$60,000. The estimated tax cost for this tax base is an estimate only based on the best information available from the County Assessor at the time of estimate.

Notice is hereby given that on Tuesday, November 4, 1986, an election will be held in Morrow County School District, Morrow County, Oregon. The polls will be open from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. The following shall be the ballot title for the measure submitted to the electors thereof:

Caption: To Establish an up-to-date Tax Base.

Question: Shall Morrow County School District's tax base be increased to \$6,996,133 from the current tax base of \$834,809.

Explanation: The purpose of this measure is to establish a realistic tax base for school district operations. The current tax base is \$834,809, representing 9% of the total funds needed to operate the school district. The \$834,809 is about 13% of the amount usually levied by the school district for operational purposes. The remaining 87% of taxes needed to balance the budget must be levied outside the tax base.

This proposed tax base measure does not levy a tax. Instead it establishes a new tax base. If this measure is approved the school district would be subject to the 6% Constitutional limitation and could not exceed this limit without voter approval.
