

Ione run over by Mountaineers

JVs stumble

A potent rushing and passing attack led the Long Creek Mountaineers to a non-conference 44-6 bombing over Ione's football team on Friday, Sept. 12.
The Mountaineers rolled up 141 yards on the ground and 176 yards in the air for 317 total yards.
"Long Creek came out with double wideouts on both sides to start the game and that confused us," Ione coach David Presley said.
The Cardinals were down only 8-6 after one quarter when Ione's Chris Rea ran in from 30 yards out.
However Rea later hurt a knee in the second quarter and wound up the game with 28 yards rushing on seven attempts.
"We kind of suffered a letdown with Chris suffering his injury," Presley said. "His own senior starting tailback and having him go down took a lot of experience out of our lineup."
The Cardinals were able to manage 171 yards rushing and 42 passing for a total of 213.
Ken Snider led Ione on the ground with 19 rushes for 101 yards. Quarterback Kevin Ball completed 5

of 12 passes for 42 yards.
"We did some good things," Presley said. "We had zero yards passing against Dayville but did find our passing game against Long Creek. The breaks just seemed to go their way."
"We just didn't show up ready to play," he added. "I was really disappointed at the negative attitude of our players. They weren't enthusiastic and just had a poor effort."
Ione will host the McKenzie Eagles this Friday at 7:30 p.m.
McKenzie, a Class "A" school from Timm Rock, could field only a 14-man roster this year and is playing a makeshift schedule against Class "B" schools this season.
"I have no idea how we'll do against them, but we'll give it a shot," Presley said.
