Cargill leases SK Terminal Elevator

Cargill announced it has reached a long-term lease agreement to operate the 840,000-bushel, truck-to-barge SK Terminal, Inc., elevator at Boardman.

"Leasing the elevator will enable Cargill to extend its farm input and export-marketing services to elevators, grain dealers and crop producers in Morrow and Umatilla counties," said Bob Thayer, manager of the company's Commodity Marketing Division branch

office in Pasco, Washington.

Thayer said the elevator is ideally suited to serve producers and other elevators south of the Columbia River. The facility will load barges with wheat, corn and barley bound for export, he said.

Cargill has other Pacific Northwest grain-marketing locations in Pocatello, Idaho; Arlington, The Dalles and Portland, Oregon; and Burbank, Pasco and Seattle, Washington.

Senior volunteer program

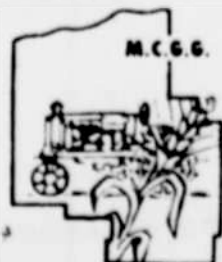
