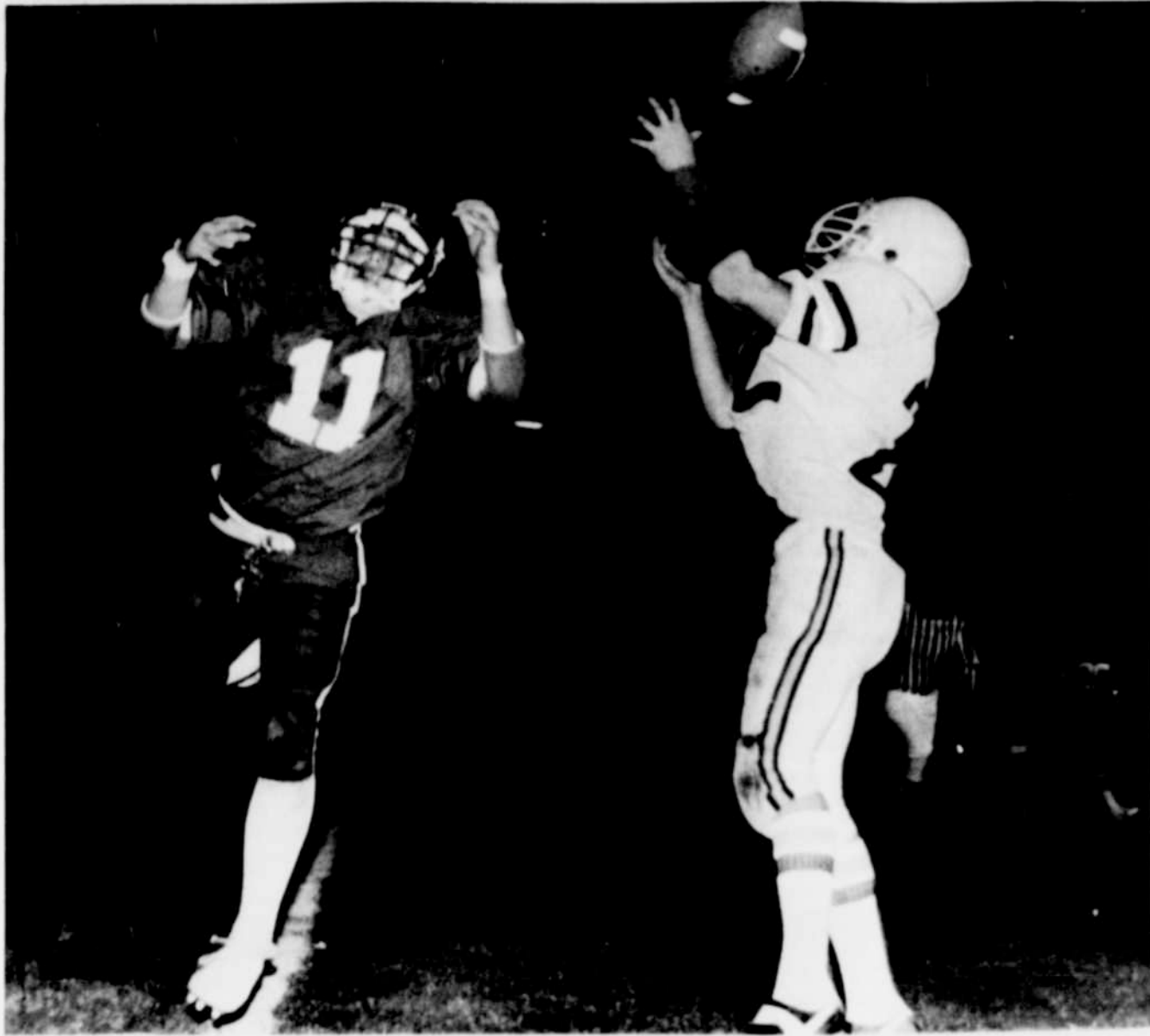


Cards clobber McKenzie, 50 - 22

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BUSINESS-AGRICULTURAL REPRESENTATIVES
ENDORSE GOLDSCHMIDT PLAN

PENDLETON - Representatives of business and agriculture from Gilliam, Morrow and Umatilla counties today announced their support for the business plan released last week by gubernatorial candidate Neil Goldschmidt. Goldschmidt's plan, called the Oregon Comeback, lists specific actions he will take as governor to help all sectors of Oregon's ailing economy.

"The Oregon Comeback is a sound, analytical approach to solving Oregon's economic problems," Bob Buchanan, a Milton-Freewater rancher, said. "Most importantly, it uses all of the state's resources, and it makes the governor of Oregon accountable to local communities."

Among those expressing support for the Goldschmidt plan are Boyd Harris, a businessman from Condon; Laura Pryor, an agriculturist from Condon; Doug Dubuque, personnel manager at Kinzua Corporation in Heppner; Don Russell, a businessman from Boardman; Lloyd Smith, a wheat rancher from Condon; and Bob and Sandra Lazinka, cattle ranchers from Pilot Rock. Buchanan, past president of the Oregon Wheat League and Sandy Lazinka are co-chairs of the Umatilla Goldschmidt for Governor Committee.

The group said the actions included in the Oregon Comeback will make state government work harder and with more focus on helping the economies of the small as well as large communities in the state.

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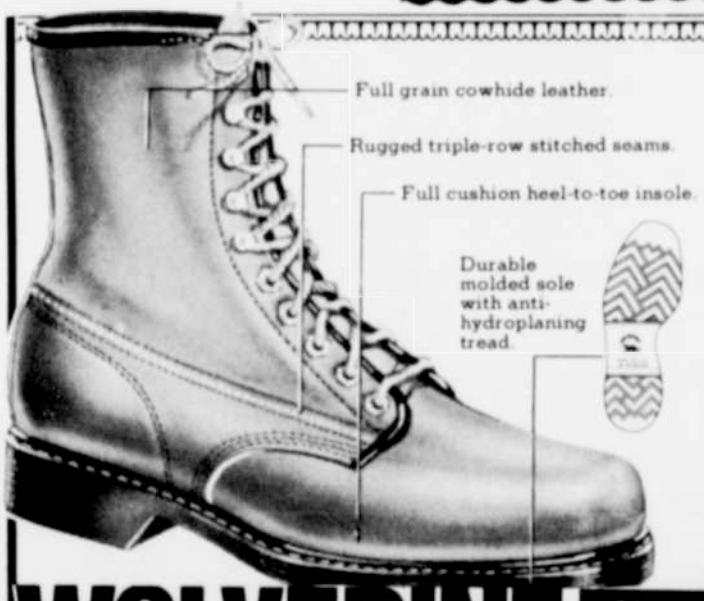
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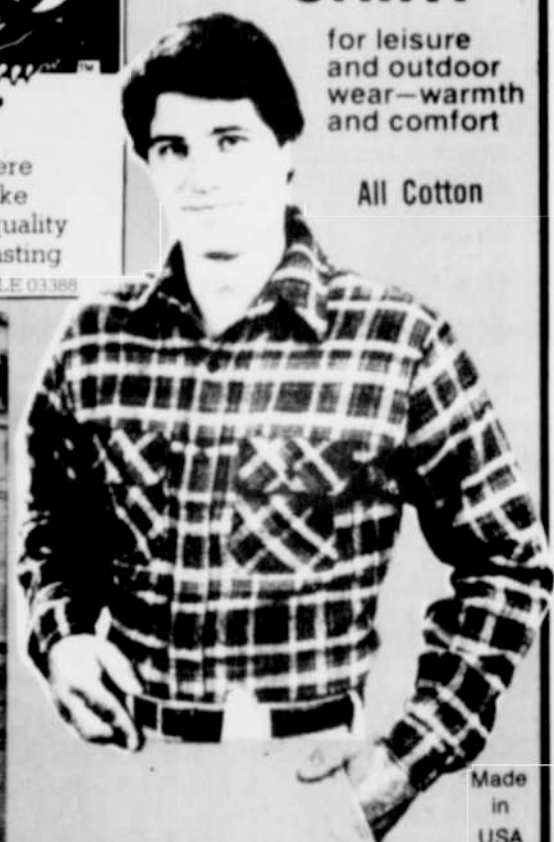
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
