JVs trample Tiger-Scots

A revamped offense and an aggressive defense powered Heppner's junior varsity football team to an easy 42-6 win over the Weston McEwen Tiger-Scots last Monday night. With the win, Heppner improved to 2-1 on the season.
Early in the opening period the Mustangs reached the Tiger-Scot 18 yard line but the drive stalled on fourth down.
Heppner got the ball back though when Mike Mahoney stripped the ball from a Tiger-Scot ball carrier and recovered it on the seven.
Three downs moved Heppner back to the 16, but on fourth-and-goal Dick Devin hit Barney Lindsay for the touchdown and Devin ran in the extra points to make the score 8-0, Heppner.
The Mustangs were back in business later in the first quarter when Doug Marlatt recovered a Weston McEwen fumble on the four.
On second and goal on the first play of the second period, Casey Pedro ran in from 10 yards out on a reverse to put Heppner ahead 14-0.
The Tiger-Scots moved inside Heppner territory to the 45. However, Pedro ended the threat on third and five, intercepting a Weston McEwen pass and returning it to the Heppner 38.
Fullback Jim Brosnan carried to the 50 on second down, and, on second and five from the 45, Russell Britt carried to the eight with only 24 seconds left on the first half clock.
Britt then carried to the one and on the following play scored with only two seconds left before the half. The Mustangs led 20-0 at the intermission with Britt rushing for over 100 yards.
In the second half Heppner picked up where they left off in the first half.
After taking over at the Tiger-Scot 43, Britt carried twice to the 29 and Brian Kollman then ran 22 yards to the 7.
From there Britt carried twice, covering two yards on the final carry to score with 8:24 remaining in the third quarter. Pedro caught the extra point pass from Devin and the Mustangs were up 28-0.
Heppner's next drive ended at the Weston McEwen 39, but the Mustangs had no problem punching the ball in on their next drive.
Britt took a Tiger-Scot punt at Weston McEwen's 35 and returned it 25 yards to the ten.
From there Britt ran in from 10 yards out and Pedro added the extra points on a reverse to increase the Mustang lead to 36-0.
The Mustangs closed out their scoring in the closing seconds of the third period.
Devin and Britt executed the Heppner option to perfection on the drive's first play. Devin rambled 11 yards from the Mustang 39 to the 50 and then pitched the ball to Britt who gained another 20 yards to the 30.
On the next play Devin hit Lindsay on the five and Lindsay bulled his way into the end zone from there. With 15 seconds to go in the third period the Mustangs were up 42-0.
The Tiger-Scots avoided the shutout with 3:44 left in the fourth quarter when Chris Nash threw to a Weston McEwen receiver who slipped behind the Heppner secondary. The play covered 43 yards and made the final score 42-6.
"The key was that our execution on both offense and defense was a lot better than the week before," JV Coach Les Payne said. "Our blocking improved and we were more aggressive."
"We didn't make as many mistakes and our execution was just a lot better", Payne added. We had a good effort by everybody. As far as a JV unit we just want to improve every game."
Heppner will host the Umatilla Vikings at 5 p.m. next Monday.

An Open Letter About Measure 14

Oregonians Against the Shutdown of the Trojan Electric Plant

September 29, 1986

Dear Voter:

One of the more drastic election proposals faced by Oregon voters in many years will appear on the November ballot.

The proposal, Measure 14, would completely shut down Oregon's only nuclear plant - the Trojan electric facility. To shut down an operating nuclear plant - which produces as much electricity as Bonneville Dam - makes no sense.

The facts about Measure 14 are simple

- Measure 14 would immediately shut down Trojan - which has reliably and economically provided much of Oregon's electricity for more than 10 years.
- Measure 14 would increase consumers' electric bills - because the inexpensive (2.6¢ per kilowatt hour) electricity from Trojan would have to be replaced by electricity from more expensive (up to 7¢ per kilowatt hour) sources.
- Measure 14 would speed up the need for an expensive and environmentally harmful coal plant - even if conservation and renewable energy sources were given priority - due to the large amount of electricity that would be lost by the shutdown.

It is vital that in November Oregonians vote **NO** on 14 to stop the shutdown of the Trojan electric plant.

As citizens concerned about the future of our state, we've joined together to provide Oregon voters with the facts about this drastic proposal - and to defeat it.
