D.A. Report

Morrow County District Attorney Richard McNerney has released the following report of business conducted during the past month:

Jacob Frederick Shilts, 20, Ione was sentenced on Sept. 19 before Judge Ralph Currin on the charge of burglary in the first degree and attempted robbery in the first degree. He was sentenced to five years formal probation to Oregon State Patrole and Probation Department to serve 93 days in the County Jail with credit for time already served and to undergo mental health evaluation for alcohol treatment at own expense and to pay court fees and fines in the amount of \$440.

Joel Medrano, 26, Boardman, was sentenced on Sept. 19 before Judge Ralph Currin on the charge of violation of a restraining order. He was sentenced to six months in jail with credit for time already served. Jail time was suspended on the condition that the defendant have no further similar violations of the law.
