

County accepts bid

Morrow County Court last Wednesday accepted the low bid from Sam Goodwin Construction for \$41,945 for the 20 ft. addition of office space at the Irrigon County Annex Building. The addition will provide more office space for the county health nurse and the county agent and make the restrooms accessible to handicapped persons. The building costs will be paid from Federal Revenue Sharing money which the county has received for this year.

In other business, the Court:
 -approved purchase of two lots in Irrigon for \$8,000.
 -approved adding two service bays at the Irrigon Road Shop.
 -approved adopting a resolution allowing retired county employees to continue medical and dental insurance coverage at their own expense under the county's policy with

the Association of Counties.
 -approved a renewal of a Certificate of Exemption for William Sharkey permitting him to haul heavy loads on a portion of Wilson and Olson Roads in Boardman.
 -requested an economic study for update of the Patterson Exchange on I-84.
 -heard an update on Courthouse renovation from Architect Bob Smith.
 -approved purchase of two tables for the Extension Service.
 -took no action on a request for an overweight hauling permit on Bombing Range Road.
 -approved all claims.
 -allowed \$1100 for new carpet at the Heppner Medical Clinic.
 -accepted Terry Thompson's resignation from the Morrow County Budget Committee and the Board of Equalization.
