# Frosh explode in second half

As Russell Britt goes, so goes the Heppner freshmen boys basketball team. With Britt exploding for 25 of his game-high 29 in the second half, the Mustangs came back to win their season-opener, 51-38, over the Riverside Pirates last Tuesday night.

The Pirates took the first period 8-6 and the second quarter 13-8 to post a 21-14 halftime advantage.

But Britt came on in the second half to sink Riverside. With Britt scoring 13 points in the third period and the Mustang defense holding the Pirates to just five points, Heppner pulled in front 33-26.

Britt netted 12 points in the final frame, the same amount as the entire Riverside team, as the Mustangs went on to win 51-38.

Britt finished the game with 29 points and 3 assists while Ryan Miller added 7 points and a team-high 11 rebounds. Eric Connor grabbed nine boards and Brian Siminoo added seven.

Both teams had their woes at the free throw line where Heppner connected on 11 of 35 shots (31 percent) and Riverside made 6 of 20 attempts (30 percent).

"We played really well in the second half," Heppner coach John Boyer said, "and our bench did a good job."

The Mustangs met the Pirates again last night but results were unavailable at press time. Heppner will host the lone junior varsity Thursday and the Pilot Rock freshmen next Tuesday. Both games

will start at 6 p.m.
