

Mustangs level Tigers 60-51

Everything came together for Heppner's boys basketball team last Saturday night as they leveled the Stanfield Tigers 60-51. Heppner im-

proved to 4-5 on the season with the win but more importantly evened its Columbia Basin Conference record at 1-1. After advancing to the state tour-

namment a year ago, big things were expected of the Mustangs this season and with Saturday night's victory over a team that many had picked to win Heppner's Eastern Division of the CBC, the Mustangs might just be back after a slow start.

Heppner used career-highs in points by Bryan Padberg (24) and Wayne Wilgers (23), a solid job on the boards against a bigger team, and a full-court press that helped turn what was a close game into a blowout to win going away.

The Mustangs pulled down a workman-like 35 rebounds and had 18 steals while turning the ball over only 15 times.

Wilgers led the way on the boards with 11, handed out a season-high 6 assists and had a career-high 6 steals to play probably the best game of his career and give proof why he was the lone junior picked on the CBC first team all-star team a year ago.

Padberg worked his way inside the land of the giants to snag a career-high eight rebounds and dish out four assists.

The Tigers, with the height in 6' 6 1/2" center Tony Brown, led early

on as Brown had the hot hand with 10 points in the first period.

However Heppner came back and tied the game at 14-14 after the first period behind seven points from Wilgers.

The Mustangs had the tempo to their liking in the second quarter and controlled it just enough to take a 26-22 lead into the locker room.

Both teams struggled offensively in the third quarter as the Tigers managed a 32-32 tie after three quarters.

With the score 37-34 in Heppner's advantage in the fourth period, the Mustangs took a timeout with 6:11 left and never regretted it.

Heppner turned up the press to the tilt and Stanfield got fried.

The Mustangs had a 43-35 lead after the Tigers scored with 4:35 left and from there the Mustangs went on an 11-5 tear to lead 54-40 with 2:36 to go.

Padberg and Wilgers used the press to their advantage as Padberg popped in 13 points in the period and Wilgers responded with 8 of his own.

However perhaps the key play of the game though came at the 3:14 mark.

Devin and Stanfield's Eric MacPherson went for a loose ball and the officials signaled for a jump ball.

But in the scramble Brown piled into Devin and was whistled for an intentional foul. Brown subsequently complained, earned himself a technical, and was ejected from the game.

After going up 54-40, the Mustangs added another mini run to further stretch their lead to 60-41 after Arkie Smith bombed in an 18-footer.

Jason Clark had nine points in the period for the Tigers and crashed in

on several free throws in the later part of the period to bring Stanfield to within 60-51 at the buzzer.

Brown led the Tigers with 18 points before his early exit while Clark added 12 but high-scoring

Senior Russell Richards leads the Viking attack and was a second team all-conference selection a year ago. A pair of 6' 3" seniors, Mike Blevins and Jerry Leicht, will lead Umatilla's inside game but the Vikings will miss junior playmaking guard Cruz Garcia who is serving a two-week suspension for a rule violation.
