

JV Fillies winning streak ends with loss to Tigers

Heppner's junior varsity girls basketball team's three-game winning streak came to an end last Saturday afternoon with a 32-21 loss to the Stanfield Tigers. The Fillies are now 3-3.
Both teams struggled through out the game but Stanfield scored just enough to win.
The first period ended in a 4-4 tie

but Lelanda Pope scored eight points in the second quarter to lead the Tigers to a 17-11 intermission advantage over the Fillies.
The third period was a 4-4 draw but Stanfield controlled the fourth quarter 11-6 en route to a 32-21 victory.
Pope and Dani Nevil led a balanced Tiger attack with eight points apiece. Angie and Jennifer Curran paced Heppner with six and five points respectively.
The Fillies will host Wahtonka at 3 p.m. on Friday and will travel to Moro on Saturday for a 1 p.m. date with the Sherman County Huskies.

Sharks lose teeth in phone cable

AT&T ran into an unexpected problem with its first deep sea fiber-optic telephone cable - shark bites. According to National Wildlife magazine, the company laid the first 72 miles of test cable in the Canary Islands in September 1985. When the cable was hoisted six months later, it had shark teeth embedded in it. Company officials believe that the sharks were attracted by movement of the cable or by the electric current that helps amplify signals.

Trees absorb dirty air

Urban pollution fighters are taking to the trees in their battle against dirty air, according to National Wildlife magazine. Recent research has demonstrated that some trees absorb huge amounts of pollutants. Red maple and white birch, for example, seem almost to thrive on sulfur dioxide, while white oaks are especially good at absorbing ozone. Los Angeles city planners say that by the year 2000, the million trees planted for the 1984 Olympics will remove 200 tons of dust and smoke from the air each day.

Donkeys guard against coyote raids

Frustrated by coyote raids on their sheep and goats, some Texas ranchers are turning to an unlikely ally - the jackass. National Wildlife magazine reports that while donkeys won't kill coyotes, they do chase them away. So far, at least 100 ranchers have decided to give them a try. Still, only females need apply. Male donkeys are apparently too ornery to be trusted, and might even attack the animals they're supposed to guard.
